Title: RESPONDING TO IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT	Number: BP 5.042
Legal Authority: Education Code Sections 70902	

- A. The Chancellor shall establish regulations regarding law enforcement access to campus buildings. These regulations shall include the following required topics:
 - 1. District police contact information to report concerns about the presence of officers engaged in immigration enforcement on any campus property.
 - 2. Samples of warrant and subpoena documents that could be used for access onto campus property, or to seize or arrest students or other individuals on campus.
 - 3. Sample responses for building personnel to use in response to officers seeking access for immigration enforcement purposes that avoids classroom interruptions, and that preserves the peaceful conduct of the school's activities.

- B. Unless required by federal or state law, the District shall not inquire specifically about a student's citizenship or immigration status or the citizenship or immigration status of a student's immediate family members parents or guardians or other family members; nor shall personnel seek or require, to the exclusion of other permissible documentation or information, documents or information that may indicate a student's immigration status, such as a green card, voter registration, a passport, or citizenship papers.

- C. Where any law contemplates submission of immigration status or citizenship status information to satisfy the requirement of a special program, the College shall not use that documentation or information for decisions related to admission or enrollment in courses or degree programs.

- D. The District is not permitted to use immigration status, citizenship status or national origin information in personal statements outside the application process, other than for legitimate educational interest, including the provision of a service or benefit relating to the student, such as health care, counseling, job placement or financial aid.
