The Working Adults Degree Program (WADP) focuses on the general education requirements necessary for Associates' or Bachelors' degrees. The Mission Campus WADP has a full complement of credit classes that meet general education requirements for an A.A. or A.S. degree. Most classes are held on weekday evenings at 3351 23rd St. between Valencia and Bartlett (close to the 24th St. BART station) at the Horace Mann School. Friday night and Saturday classes will be held at the new temporary headquarters of the Mission Campus at 375 Bartlett. The convenience of the Mission Campus and its smaller size make it attractive to WADP students.

In addition to the regular semester-length classes offered at the Mission Campus, the WADP has offered two or three courses that last for only 6 weeks. Currently, the courses are IDST 37 (Ethnic Minorities in the U.S.) and Psychology 1. During the designated 6 weeks, the classes meet on Friday nights from 6:00-10:00 p.m. AND Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. for a total of 54 class hours. These accelerated classes have proved popular with students who want to fit in another class in a short time period.

The WADP is characterized by a high degree of support and priority registration. The program advisor works closely with students to help them stay focused on reaching their educational goals in the shortest possible time. To be part of the WADP, students must take at least one class at the Mission Campus. As long as that condition is met, priority registration is possible for necessary classes that may not be available at the Mission Campus.

There are currently approximately 120 students actively enrolled in the Working Adults Degree Program. With the construction of a new Mission Campus, many more credit classes will be offered to the program to better assist the working student.
