California Student Aid Commission's Child Development Grant Program

CCSF students - up to \$1,000/year

SFSU / or other 4 year college or university students – up to \$2,000/year

For students that meet the following criteria:

- US citizen or eligible non-citizen
- California resident
- Meets Selective Services filing requirements
- Must submit a 2004-2005 FAFSA – www.fafsa.ed.gov
- Be enrolled in courses leading to a Child Development Permit
- Must be at least a half time student making satisfactory academic progress
- Must commit to teaching in a licensed children's center in California for a period of one year for each year of benefits received (up to 6,000 total possible)
- Must be nominated by Kathleen White in the CDEV Department

Child Care Provider Loan Forgiveness Program

Loan Forgiveness Program for employees of Child Care Facilities.

Must meet the following criteria:

- Child Care Provider Loan Forgiveness is granted on a first-come, first-served basis and is subject to the availability of funds. The U.S. Department of Education will continue to accept completed Child Care Provider Loan Forgiveness Applications until funds are no longer available for this program.
- If you are a new applicant, you must be a new borrower. For the purpose of this loan forgiveness program, you are a new borrower if you had no outstanding balance on a Direct Loan and/or an FFEL program loan on October 7, 1998, or on the date that you obtain a Direct Loan or an FFEL program loan after October 7, 1998.
- You must have received an Associate's Degree or Bachelor's Degree in the field of early childhood education or child care that was awarded from an institution of higher education after October 7, 1998.
