**Internships, Mentoring and Service Learning Opportunities**

**Child Development 71** – Supervised Elementary School Fieldwork – 3 units: Students are placed in elementary schools in San Francisco and complete 90 hours of supervised fieldwork and attend classes. This course satisfies the pre-credential requirement for elementary credential program entrance and the pre-intern requirement. Reimbursement: volunteer hours- Enroll through CCSF registration process.

**Child Development 72** – Early Childhood Supervised Fieldwork – 3 units: Students are placed in preschools in San Francisco with an Early Childhood Mentor or in City College sites and complete 90 hours of supervised fieldwork and attend classes. Students earn hours towards Early Childhood Permit requirements and CCL licensing experience requirements. Reimbursement: volunteer hours unless student is enrolled in the TANF CDC Program or is a lab-aide or is a current staff member at placement site. Enroll through CCSF registration process.

**Child Development 75** – Supervised High/Middle School Fieldwork – 3 units: Students are placed in high or middle schools in San Francisco and complete 90 hours of supervised fieldwork and attend classes. This course satisfies the pre-credential requirement for credential program entrance and the pre-intern requirement. Reimbursement/volunteer hours or lab-aide funds may be available for students placed with math, science or CTE teachers if student is interested in teaching math or science. **Paid internship (\$9.00/hr) of up to 90 hours available to students interested in assisting with science, math or CTE instruction in specific SFUSD classrooms.** Contact: Deborah Ruiz Steele– 239-3890.

**California Early Childhood Mentor Program:** Working San Francisco early childhood teachers at the Master Teacher Level or higher with at least 3 years of experience can mentor students at their early childhood work sites. Limited space is available. Directors with experience can apply to mentor fellow directors in a peer support program. Reimbursement: teachers and directors are reimbursed for their work. Teachers and Directors must apply through CCSF Mentor Program Coordinator, Sheila Norman, 452-7004 or ccdfs@aol.com. **Teacher Prep & Math Dept. Math Mentoring** – Future teachers interested in mentoring students in math on campus at CCSF in the afternoons can get experience mentoring adult CCSF students. Afternoon hours are available. All math levels needed. Reimbursement: Students can earn \$9.00/hour as a lab-aide. Students must apply with Chuck Burke in Math at 239-3306.

**Service Learning** – Child development students interested in being lab-aides and assisting child observation teachers at campus child observation sites should call Joanne Devine at 239-3814 or Maria Chu at 452-5905. Students may also be interested in working in our CCSF Campus Child Development Centers. Reimbursement: Students can earn \$9.00/hour as a lab-aide or may utilize work-study funding for these positions if eligible and should call Maria Chu at 452-5905. Future teachers previously enrolled in CDEV 71 or CDEV 75 or CDEV 72 can continue their placements at their school sites for additional semesters by enrolling in CDEV 111 (65 hours volunteer/75 hours paid), CDEV 112 (130 hours volunteer/150 hours paid) or CDEV 113 (195 hours volunteer/225 hours paid) for 1-3 units of work experience credit for total semester hours.

**Service Learning Opportunities in Various Departments**- Students can participate in Service Learning opportunities providing outreach to children and youth in various departments, ranging from astronomy projects, habitat restoration, chemistry tutoring and geology experiences. Math & Science Teachers Assistants – Selected math, science and CTE teachers on campus are available to train future math & science teachers by hosting teacher assistants in their classrooms. Especially useful for future high school teachers, students can learn teaching strategies and receive support from CCSF teachers. Students will then have classroom experience and can take CDEV 75 to utilize their training in an SFUSD high school classroom or CCSF classroom.
