A satirical look at American mainstream comics and culture, these graphic stories by top Asian American artists are centered around superheroes exploring a shadowy history of our country.

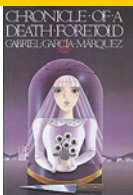

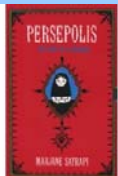
