2009 ALICE EASTWOOD SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INFORMATION

Alice Eastwood was a renowned self taught botanist and curator for the California Academy of Sciences during the late 19th and early 20th century. She was most famous for saving nearly all of the herbarium specimens after the 1906 earthquake.

Each year the San Francisco Garden Club honors the memory of Alice Eastwood by awarding scholarships in Floral Artistry, Horticulture, and Botany to outstanding students at City College of San Francisco. Previous recipients of this scholarship may be considered for an additional award. The San Francisco Garden Club will review applications, conduct interviews, and choose the recipients of the Scholarships. Dates for each activity are shown below.

Scoring the applications for Alice Eastwood Scholarships is defined within the following parameters:

Interviews are required and are scheduled for Tuesday, April 21, 2009 from 9:00 AM-3:00 PM

You are encouraged to bring a portfolio showing examples of your work.

The General Criteria for interview evaluation:

1. Academic:

- a. courses completed
- b. grade point average
- c. clarity of goals
- d. portfolio

2. Personal:

- a. poise, personality
- b. appearance
- c. handling of the interview, i.e., preparedness, ability to articulate
- d. attitude

3. Professional:

- a. potential for success
- b. potential for professional contribution to profession/society
- c. industry involvement through volunteer work, part-time jobs, participation in competition, etc.
- d. plans for use of award

All scholarships will be accompanied by a certificate naming the student as a recipient of that particular award. Required interviews will be held on April 18, 2009.

Recipients are expected to attend the awards ceremony Thursday, May 7, 2009 at 4:00 PM.
