- Two to three semesters of linked classes that fulfill graduation and transfer requirements
- A community of students, teachers, and advisors working together to help you do well & stay on track for graduation and transfer

MHA at CCSF

Who can apply?

Anyone ready for English 92 or ESL 160 or higher. Admissions is ongoing; seats are available until filled.



How long is the MHA program?

The MHA program will take at least one year to complete. Students must be at the Eng 1A and Math 840 level to complete the final two semesters of MHA coursework (Levels II and III) in a learning community. For students not yet at that level, we will work with you to develop an individualized plan based on your English and Math placement.

What classes will I take as part of MHA?

Students will have individualized MHA pathways:

MHA Level I: (for students not yet at Eng 1A level)

- HLTH 53: Health Science (offered fall or spring)
- Supplemental Instructional Support course (optional)
- MHA health-infused English course (according to placement level)

MHA Level II: (for students at the Eng 1A level)

- HLTH 221: Health & Social Justice
- MHA health-infused English 1A

MHA Level III: (for students who have completed Eng 1A)

- HLTH 40: Urban Health Policy
- MHA health-infused Psych 5: Statistics for Behavioral Sciences

Where do I go once I've completed MHA?

MHA is designed to help you transfer to the CSU. Once your requirements are complete you may transfer to any major to complete your Bachelor's Degree. MHA is a fast track to majors such as Health Education, Social Work, Sociology, Child & Adolescent Development, Urban Studies, Political Science, Recreation, Parks & Tourism, & Psychology.

Who can apply?

Any incoming freshman can apply to MHA for



either the fall or spring semesters of their freshman year. Admissions is ongoing; seats are available until filled.

How long is the MHA program?

MHA is a three semester learning community.

Each semester students take one MHA class and one linked, healthinfused General Education class dedicated to MHA students.

What classes will I take as part of MHA?

MHA Freshman Year:

- HED 120: 1st Yr. Experience/Health & Ed. Justice (offered fall or spring freshman year)
- An MHA health-infused General Education class in either Critical Thinking (Ethnic Studies 110) or Oral Communication (Comm 150)

MHA Sophmore Year:

Fall

- HED 221: Health & Social Justice
- MHA health-infused Eng 214: Second Yr. English Composition

Spring

- HED 231: Health Justice in Social Policy
- MHA health-infused Math 124: Elementary Statistics

Where do I go once I've completed MHA?

Once you have completed your lower division requirements you can complete your upper division requirements towards your Bachelor's Degree. MHA is a fast track to majors such as Health Education, Social Work, Sociology, Child & Adolescent Development, Urban Studies, Political Science, Recreation, Parks & Tourism, & Psychology.
