# CRIME ALERT

**There was a report of an armed robbery with a knife that occurred on Thursday evening, November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2009.**

A City College of San Francisco student had left the Ocean Campus at 6:00 pm and walked Eastbound Ocean on the south side of the street. She turned into the pedestrian path toward the Eastside lower level entrance of the Balboa Bart Station where she was approached by two Hispanic males who said "Give us the money!"

One of the suspects grabbed her by the wrist which was holding her cell phone. He struggled to take her purse which was draped over her shoulder. The student resisted. The suspect let go of her wrist and pulled a knife with approximately a five inch blade from his pocket and said again, "Give us the money!" They took her cell phone and a ring from her hand. The suspects fled on foot north bound on the pedestrian path towards Ocean Ave. The student was not injured.
