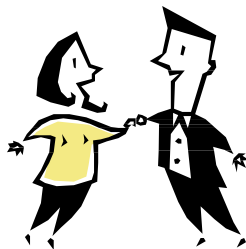

Immigration Reminder

What Is Practical Training?

Practical training may be authorized to an F-1 visa international student who has been enrolled on a full time basis, in a SEVIS-approved college or university for one full academic year. A student may be authorized 12 months of practical training, and becomes eligible for another 12 months of practical training when he or she changes to a higher educational level. Students in English language training programs are not eligible for practical training. An eligible student may request employment authorization for practical training in a position that is directly related to his or her major area of study. There are two types of practical training available: Curricular Practical Training and Optional Practical Training.
