

THE DUDLEY YASUDA SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: First Friday in March

The Dudley Yasuda Memorial Scholarship was established by his colleagues in the Department of Behavioral Sciences after his murder on April 12, 1982. He taught psychology in the department for fifteen years. His students viewed him as a dynamic, inspirational, and charismatic teacher who influenced their lives. Additional contributions were made in honor of Bob Dunbar who retired in 2000 after 31 years as a CCSF sociology instructor.

WHO: CCSF students who are transferring to a baccalaureate institution with the goal of obtaining a degree in anthropology, psychology, sociology, or social welfare.

AWARD: One \$200 scholarship

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
2. Be currently enrolled in a minimum of 9 units at CCSF.
3. Have completed at least 36 units at CCSF with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
4. Have completed or be in the process of completing three behavioral sciences classes.
