VOCATIONAL NURSING PROGRAMS

Licensed Vocational Nursing

The Vocational Nursing Program of the City College of San Francisco Campuses is a full-time, eighteen-month course of instruction, which leads to a certificate in vocational nursing. The program is accredited by the California Board of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technician Examiners. Students who complete the program may take a state examination for licensure in vocational nursing. Theory classes are taught at the John Adams Campus. A variety of teaching methods are used which include lecture, demonstration, clinical practice and observation, participation in patient-care conferences, problem-solving discussions, and special assignments. For clinical practice, classes are divided into small groups and conducted in several hospitals. In order to provide varied clinical experience, students are rotated to different hospitals and teachers during the program. Graduates of the LVN program who take and pass the State Board Examination work in hospitals, long-term care facilities, clinics and doctors' offices.

Nurse Assistant/Home Health Aide

This 18 week program will qualify you for an entry level position as a health care provider. Graduates can seek positions in ACUTE CARE HOSPITALS, CONVALESCENT HOSPITALS, and as HOME CARE PROVIDERS. Study will include fundamentals of nursing and nutrition in health and disease. Upon successful completion of this program, you will be awarded: 12 units of college credit, and be eligible for the Nurse Assistant Competency Examination for Certification. Classes are held at the Southeast Campus.

There are two (2) separate applications for admission to School of Health & Physical Education programs. You must apply for admission to City College AND for admission to CNA program. City College applications should be completed and filed with Admissions Office prior to your taking the placement test. CNA applications are provided at the CNA program orientations.

HEALTH CARE TECHNOLOGY PROGRAMS

Cardiovascular Technology Program (CVT)

CVT Program focuses on adult cardiac ultrasound, "Echocardiography". Starting in Fall 2006 the CVT Program will be 2 academic years. The echo curriculum includes the following: cardiac anatomy and pathology, ultrasound physics, the 2D/M-Mode/Doppler findings associated with normal and abnormal cardiac pathology and stress echo. The CVT class content includes: Advanced ECG interpretation, cardiac pharmacology, and pacemaker technology. Students will obtain cardiac instrumentation and ultrasound scanning skills in the CVT labs and the assigned clinical internships.

Emergency Medical Technician I

This program is offered only by the City College of San Francisco in the John Adams Campus Health Care Technology Department. Its primary goal is the instruction of a highly proficient Emergency Medical Technician who is responsible for the emergency treatment and transportation of the pre-hospital ill and injured persons. The duration of the Emergency Medical Technician training is 4 months. Clinical practice and observation is done at various ambulance companies.

Health Information Technology

The Health Information Technology Program provides instruction and clinical experience to assist students develop the theoretical and technical skills necessary to maintain components of health information systems consistent with the medical, administrative, ethical, legal, accreditation and regulatory requirements of the health care delivery system.

EKG Technician

EKG Technician is a 2-semester course of instruction, which meets 6 hours a week. Students learn to operate EKG machines, mount tracings, interpret rates and rhythms; basic cardiovascular anatomy, terminology, and physiology are included in the curriculum.

Unit Coordinator (non-credit)

Unit Coordinator is a one-semester, 9 hour-per-week course, emphasizing medical terminology, transcription of physician orders, body structures and functions, communication, and providing assistance to medical professionals in a variety of ways. A one-month placement in a local hospital offers valuable work experience. (Location: Southeast Campus)

Medical Assisting

Medical Assisting Program trains students to perform administrative and selected clinical and laboratory procedures for employment in physicians' offices, hospitals, clinics, medical laboratories and home care agencies. Students learn to draw blood, give injections, take electrocardiograms and assist the physician, as well as manage the financial and administrative areas of the office or clinic.

Pharmacy Technician

This is a 2-semester credit course of instruction of 12 units/semester, which will prepare the graduates for a career in a retail pharmacy, homecare pharmacy, or hospital pharmacy to assist the pharmacist in the ordering, preparation and distribution of medications.
