**Johnnie L. Carter, Jr.**  
*Vice President, Board of Trustees*

Johnnie L. Carter, Jr. is Vice President of the Board of Trustees of the San Francisco Community College District for 2006. He also served as Vice President in 2002. Mr. Carter was elected to a full four-year term as Trustee in 2002. He was appointed to the Board in March 2001 by San Francisco Mayor Willie L. Brown, Jr.

Mr. Carter is a Legislative Consultant to California State Senate President pro Tempore Don Perata. Mr. Carter's combination of state and local legislative experience along with an understanding of the cultural, economic and political dynamics of the City have made him successful in drafting and moving legislation in the areas of public safety, consumer protection, education, and delivering state resources to the City and City College of San Francisco.

Trustee Carter learned early on the importance of honest hard work and standing up for what is right. From his first jobs delivering newspapers and cutting grass, Mr. Carter continued to work in various jobs to finance his education.

While a student, Mr. Carter was a mentor for at-risk youth in a YMCA sponsored after-school program. He

organized the Undergraduate Black Students Union and volunteered in several local elections that helped develop his leadership skills. His leadership potential was recognized when he was selected from 2,500 applicants to be one of the 18 to participate in the Jesse Unruh Assembly Fellowship Program.

Mr. Carter continues to be active in mentoring and youth programs. He is a member of the San Francisco NAACP and Residents of the Southeast Sector (R.O.S.E.S.). Mr. Carter is also on the Executive Board of the Bayview Opera House/Ruth Williams Memorial Theater, Thad Brown Boys Academy, and the San Francisco African American Historical & Cultural Society.

Trustee Carter holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology with an emphasis in Criminology and Corrections from California State University, Northridge. He attended law school at the University of San Francisco.
