The City College of San Francisco will receive sealed bids at the Office of Facilities Planning and Construction, 50 Phelan Avenue, Science Hall, Room 140, San Francisco, CA 94112 on:

Tuesday, January 19, 2010 at 2:00 PM for

C.C.S.F. / A.D.A. Upgrades & Barrier Removal Project – Ocean Campus; Visual Arts, Arts Extension, and Horticulture – Phase II”

Bids will be publicly opened at 2:00 PM on the same day and at the same location.

COST ESTIMATE: \$100,000

SCOPE OF WORK: **A.D.A.: upgrades within 3 different buildings including but not limited to: incidental concrete work, handrail modifications, and casework and workstation modifications, plumbing fixture modifications, accessories and partitions, modification to doors/frames/hardware, and signage.**

TIME OF WORK: 120 Calendar Days from Notice to Proceed Date.

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES: \$1,000/Calendar Day

PRE- BID CONFERENCE: A **Pre-bid Conference will be held Friday, January 8th, 2010 at 10:00 AM**, sharp. The meeting will be held at Project Manager’s office located at 50 Phelan Ave., Science Hall, Room 140, San Francisco, CA 94112.

SITE ACCESS: The site is available for review during the bid period. Appointments must be scheduled with the project manager prior to arrival.

BONDS REQUIRED: Bid - 10 % of bids over \$15,000
Performance & Payment - 100 % of bids over \$25,000.

CONTRACTOR’S LICENSE: Bidder must have a valid Contractor’s license to bid work and must possess said license appropriate for the trade work being performed.

SMALL LOCAL BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (SLBE):

It is the policy of the San Francisco Community College District to encourage full and equitable business opportunities in the areas of construction and construction-related services for all small local business

enterprises wishing to do business with the District. Prime contractors are encouraged to seek the participation of local small, minority and women owned firms as subcontractors for this project and all District public works projects. Local small, minority and women owned firms qualified to perform work on this project are encouraged to attend the pre-bid meeting to meet prospective prime/general contractor bidders for this work or to bid as prime contractors.

SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (SBE):

Prospective bidders and subcontractors are on notice that the Board of Trustees has adopted a policy to encourage and facilitate full and equitable business opportunities, specifically in the area of construction contracting for all small businesses wishing to do business with the District. As such, the District has determined that the minimum small business subcontracting participation goal on this project to be twenty five percent (25%). Please review the Small Business Enterprise Rules, Regulations, Requirements and Forms section of this bid document for more information on how to comply with this contract requirement. In addition, qualified SBE firms are encouraged to bid as prime contractors for this project. For SBE qualified prime contractors, the District offers an incentive bid discount on all construction contracts greater than \$15,000 but less than \$5 million. The bid discounts is 5%, or a maximum of \$50,000 per project. Accepted SBE certifications are the California Department of General Services and San Francisco Human Rights Commission, which must be submitted at time of bid if the discount is to be applied for. Carefully read the S.B.E. Rules & Regulations, found elsewhere in this manual, for specific instructions and details.

HIRE LOCAL WORKERS POLICY:

The Board of Trustees' has adopted a policy intended to target employment opportunities created by the District's construction contracts to its qualified students, particularly graduates of its construction job training programs. In addition, contractors bidding on this project are encouraged to recruit and hire qualified residents of the City and County of San Francisco for work created by this project, as feasible.

DISTRICT RIGHTS:

The City College of San Francisco reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive any irregularities. District to forfeit the General or Prime Contractor's bid security.
