DSPS has tags for service animals

Identification tags are being distributed by Disabled Students Programs and Services (DSPS) to students who have service animals on District campuses.

The tags are red metal tags stamped, "Authorized Service Animal SFCCD," with the semester and year indicated on the reverse side. The tags come on a chain which can be put around the neck of the dog, or can be attached to a dog's collar. Students are required to get a new tag each semester from DSPS, but because of the reduced DSPS staff and schedule for Summer, the Spring tag will also suffice for Summer class attendance.

"We are hoping that this will be an easy way for students with service animals to alert public safety officers and other district staff that their service animal is authorized to be on campus," says **Linda R. Jackson**, Associate Director/ADA Coordinator.

RECOGNITION OF ACHIEVEMENT

Alum Frederic Tubach co-authors book on WWII

Frederic C. Tubach, who studied at City College of San Francisco and went on to a career as a faculty member of UC Berkeley, has co-authored a memoir about growing up in Germany during World War II. Titled *An Uncommon Friendship: From Opposite Sides of the Holocaust*, Tubach wrote the book with his longtime friend **Bernat Rosner**, a Hungarian Jew who lost his entire family in the Holocaust. Tubach's father was a German Army soldier during the war. The book, written with **Sally Patterson Tubach**, is published by the University of California Press (\$24.95).
