HIV/STD Office plans activities to observe World AIDS Day

Saturday, December 1st, is World AIDS Day and on this day, millions of people across the globe will come together to reflect on the impact HIV/AIDS has had on our local communities, our nation and our world. The CCSF community will have an opportunity to participate in this global observance in two ways.

On **December 3rd** the HIV/STD Office and numerous other campus-wide supporters host a forum entitled *Social Discrimination and HIV Risk*. Three distinguished HIV educators and researchers — **Rafael M. Diaz** of San Francisco State University's Center for Community Research, **Josh Bamberger** of the San Francisco Department of Public Health, and **Jennifer Lovich** of Urban Health Study — will examine the degree to which HIV disproportionately affects the disenfranchised, the poor and people of color. The event will be held in The Louise and Claude Rosenberg, Jr., Library and Learning Resource Center, Room 305, from 11 A.M. to 1:30 P.M. Outside the library's main entrance, Project Safe Club will provide information on HIV/STDs and other health-related topics, and counseling and testing services will also be made available.

Beginning on November 26 and running through December 14 the "HIV Time Line" will be posted in Cloud Hall across from the Health Science classrooms 332 and 333. The "HIV Time Line" is a very moving display of the history of the HIV epidemic in the U.S. over the past 20-plus years. People will have the opportunity to participate in the display by adding their personal story to this living mosaic, recording the effect of this epidemic on our personal lives, and in turn, the entire CCSF community.

Begun in 1988, World AIDS Day seeks to bring messages of compassion, hope, solidarity and understanding about HIV/AIDS to every country in the world. Today, 36.1 million people live with HIV¹ and since the beginning of the pandemic, 27,770 San Franciscans have been diagnosed with AIDS². Behind these numbers are the faces of people who seek care, treatment and preventative services. Curbing the spread of HIV/AIDS requires people worldwide, from all sectors of society, to intervene.

The HIV/STD Office invites members of the City College community to join in solidarity with people across the globe to demonstrate care and concern about HIV and AIDS, and to remind others of the need for their support and commitment.

Lee Meriwether to appear here in 'Happy End'

Lee Meriwether — CCSF alumna, Miss America and Emmy nominee — returns to the Phelan/Ocean Avenue campus to appear in a cameo role in the Brecht/Weill musical *Happy End* **December 7-16** in the Diego Rivera Theatre. The Music and Theatre Arts Departments' collaborative production, supported in part by a Performance Grant from the Kurt Weill Foundation for Music of New York, is the first Bay Area production in more than 25 years.

Directed by Dr. **David Ostwald**, who heads the opera program at Queens College in New York, and with music direction by CCSF Music faculty **Michael Shahani**, along with a cast of 25 CCSF Theatre Arts and Music students, the production features Weill's original orchestrations. With a plot remarkably similar to *Gypsy* and *Dolls*, but preceding

Hit songs include "Surabaya Johnny," "The Dalay Song" and "The Ballad of the Lily of Hell."

Happy End plays Fridays and Saturdays, **December 7, 8, 14, and 15** at 8 P.M., with a Sunday matinee on **December 16** at 2 P.M. Cabaret-style seating is limited.
