City College offers \$5,000 reward for arrest and conviction of arsonist

Room 348 of Cloud Hall was severely damaged by fire on the evening of Tuesday, February 5, 2002, the latest in a series of four blazes set by an arsonist or arsonists who remain at large. City College of San Francisco is offering a \$5,000 reward for information which leads to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible. All of the fires were set between the late afternoon and early evening hours when activity on the Phelan/Ocean campus is less than during the day or evening. Arson is a crime. CCSF stages world premiere of 'Silence Within the Darkness'

French club screens 'Sugar Cane Alley'

Le Cercle Français presents the film *Sugar Cane Alley* (La rue Cases-Nègres), in French and Creole with English subtitles, on Thursday, February 21 from 11 A.M. to 1 P.M. in Rosenberg 205E (the Language Center classroom). CCSF librarian Sirous Monajami, who earned a doctorate in Film Studies from the Université Paul-Valéry, Montpellier, France, will lead a post-film discussion (en français). Based on the novel by Joseph Zobel, this is the story of Jose, a bright, 11-year old orphan, and his grandmother who is determined to save him from the hard life of sugar plantations on French-occupied Martinique in the 1930s.
