**Plan alternatives to elevators in  
Cloud Hall and Science Building**

I am writing to inform you of the upcoming renovations to the Science Hall and Cloud Hall elevators. From **March 31 to May 5**, both of these elevators will be out of service 24 hours a day. Please note that Spring Break falls within this timeframe. Funding and legal constraints do not permit the District to postpone this work until summer.

Although the elevators will not look different, this much awaited safety upgrade changes their 1940s workings and wiring to 21st century standards. Once the project is completed the "upgraded" elevators will have new controllers, new motors, refurbished cabs, new smoke doors and new fire alarm devices.

Facilities Planning, the Office of Instruction and Disabled Student Programs & Services (DSPS) are working together to assist students who may need an accommodation due to a mobility impairment. DSPS assists students with documented disabilities who are unable to climb stairs at all. DSPS also understands that there may be students who are able to climb stairs, but with difficulty. In an effort to lessen the impact as much as possible DSPS suggests that all instructors who teach in a classroom located in Science Hall (2nd or 3rd floors) or Cloud Hall (2nd or 3rd floors) do the following:

- Announce the upcoming shutdown dates of the elevators to the students immediately and, if a student needs an accommodation due to a mobility impairment, have the student contact DSPS at 415.452.5481 or come to the DSPS office at the Rosenberg Library Room 323.
- Inform the students that a second elevator exists in Cloud Hall. It runs from the 2nd floor to the 3rd and 4th (Mezzanine level) floors. There will be signs posted near entrances in Cloud Hall to identify the location of the 2nd elevator.

• Encourage students to plan ahead and search out alternate routes. For students who are able to climb stairs, but with difficulty, offer solutions such as lessening the load they will need to carry up and down the stairs. Promote the idea of classmates helping out by taking a friend's backpack and walking up and down the stairs with them. Note that some students may be late for class because of the added time in taking the stairs.

If a student identifies him or herself to you as having a mobility impairment and requests a specific accommodation, refer them to DSPS. # John Adams Campus hosts Community Health Fair

For the eighth-year in a row, the School of Health & Physical Education and the John Adams Campus will be hosting a comprehensive Community Health Fair at the 1860 Hayes Street site. It will take place on **Thursday, April 3**, from 9 A.M. to 2 P.M.

The focus of this year's fair is two-fold:

- It will be an expression of City College's gratitude to the residents of San Francisco for the support that they have shown to us — especially, for supporting Proposition A on the Fall 2001 ballot.
- The second focus of the fair will be to provide health services to our students and the general public that attend the fair that will emphasize a preventative approach to health care.

Once again, a number of local health care providers are donating their time and services to give free medical care and advice to the students and members of the general public attending the event. A partial list of the providers includes the American College of Traditional Chinese Medicine, University of the Pacific School of Dentistry, Life Chiropractic College – West, California Transplant Donor Network, American Cancer Society, Community Health Resource Center, Planned Parenthood, Family Violence Prevention Fund, San Francisco Vegetarian Society, San Francisco Health Plan, Bay Area Legal Aid, and others.

Blood Centers of the Pacific will be conducting a blood drive during the fair as well. Donate blood!

Also providing services and information at the fair are various departments of the School of Health and Physical Education, the Department of Disabled Student Programs & Services, CCSF Project Survive, and the CCSF Student Health Center.

Services that will once again be offered at the fair include back exams, blood pressure screenings, body composition analysis, anemia screenings, EKGs, first aid tips, hearing tests, HIV testing, nutrition counseling, cholesterol and glucose screenings, massage and stress reduction techniques, and vegetarian cooking demonstrations.

All are welcome; it is a community event. All services are free (except cholesterol testing and glucose screenings which require a \$5 fee) to students and the general public.

## Ancient play addresses current crisis

City College of San Francisco teachers and students participated in a world-wide reading of *Lysistrata* on March 3 to voice opposition to President **George W. Bush's** pre-emptive attack on Iraq.

Along with people at readings in all 50 states and more than 59 countries, teachers and students at CCSF met in the Rosenberg Library Room 304 at 2 P.M. on March 3 to read a play **Aristophanes** wrote about 2400 years ago. In the play, set in 413 BC Greece, Athenian women go on a sex strike to force their husbands and lovers to end the Peloponnesian War and establish peace treaties. City College's event included a message from Sappho and a man who stops sleeping with his lover, a general.

The dual purposes of the readings were to protest a pre-emptive attack on Iraq and to raise money for charities that work for peace and offer humanitarian aid to the Middle East and elsewhere.

**Steve Winn**, who was among those in attendance, did a write-up on the event among other Bay Area readings of *Lysistrata* in the *SF Chronicle* on March 4.

The statement on the [www.lysistrataproject.org](http://www.lysistrataproject.org) web site reads as follows: "Though (the) Lysistrata Project represents many individuals with a range of opinions, we all oppose a unilateral, preemptive attack on Iraq by the United States. We support the continued work of United Nations weapons inspectors."

## Café Musée to talk of American art in French

Café Musée will present a convivial brunch, slide presentation and discussion — all *en français* — **Saturday, March 29** on the topic *American Realism Part I: From the American Revolution to "American Gothic"*. It will begin at 9:30 A.M. and continue through 12:30 P.M. in Room V114 of the the Visual Arts Building on the Ocean Avenue Campus. The public is welcome to attend.

**Renée Morel**, who teaches in the Foreign Language and Art departments, notes that her talk will "Explore the tremendous scope of the American Realist tradition, from the 'primitive' portraits or landscapes going back to the colonial era to the rural scenes of the Regionalist movement, made famous by **Grant Wood's** 'American Gothic.'

"From its beginnings, American painting was motivated by the desire to represent reality, whether in maps, images of leaders, heroes or ordinary people. Later, the invention of photography reinforced the commitment to reality," says Morel.
