Eunice Azzani speaks at Contract Ed.'s 'Industry Breakfast'

Eunice Azzani, Board President of the Foundation of City College of San Francisco and Managing Director of the San Francisco office of Korn/Ferry International, spoke of *Coaching and Developing Your Employees* to attendees at the CCSF Office of Contract Education's Industry Breakfast held April 2 at the Educated Palate of the Downtown Campus.

Her message was you own your career, not your job. Focus on developing yourself and your employees for their careers. Jobs come and go.

The 5 "Cs" for companies:

Clarity – Make sure you and your employees are clear about what the work is and what's most important.

Communication – Do it often. It takes hearing something three times to get the message across! Communicate in person, with letters and phone calls. Email is OK, but don't rely on it for everything. Remember that communication is listening, not just talking.

Competencies – Invest in your people. Allow them to grow, develop, and change.

Change – If you're not standing on the edge, you're taking up too much space. Be ready and eager for change.

Courage – Be honest in your communications. This is not easy, but it is important and effective. Use clear, honest, courageous communication, especially when telling bad or difficult news. The results will be better.

The 5 "Ps" for people:

Passion – Life is too precious to waste it on activities where you have no passion. Find out what you really enjoy doing, what you do exceedingly well. They are probably linked.

Priorities – What is a priority for you? Advancement? Money? Flexibility?

Possibilities – Look at them honestly. Hold your manager responsible where appropriate. Have courage to pursue the possibilities.

Planning – Take charge of your own career planning, but remember that asking for help can be powerful.

Perseverance – Don't give up, even when people say it can't be done. Know your story. Tell your story. Save all your fan mail, "ego mail," to look at when you feel low. Follow your passion.

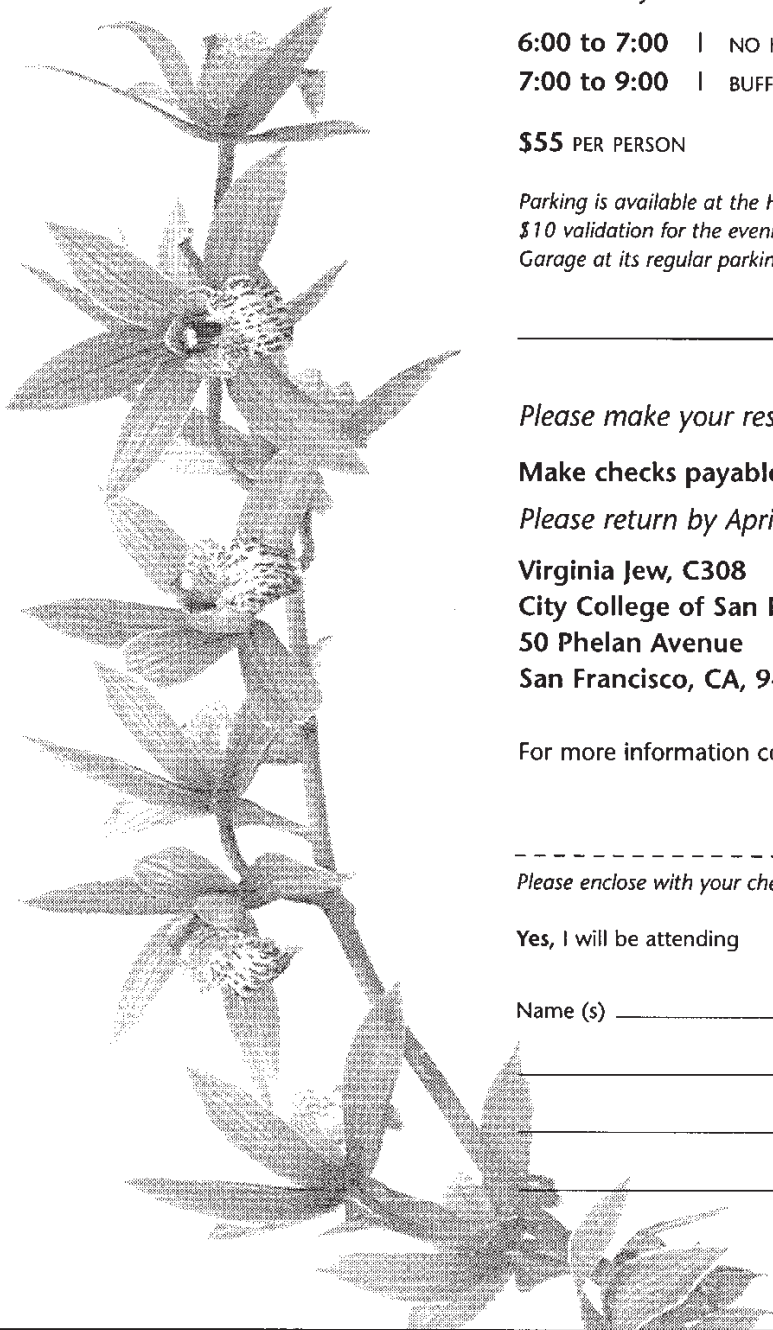
