Latino/Hispanic Heritage Month celebrations listed

City College of San Francisco will celebrate National Latino/Hispanic Heritage Month with a series of events beginning September 15 and continuing through November 4. The theme of the activities will be “Latinos/Hispanic Americans: Making A Difference In Our Communities and Our Nation.” All events are free and open to the public. Unless otherwise noted, all activities listed take place on the Ocean Avenue Campus, 50 Phelan Ave.

The observance begins with a special exhibition titled *La Lucha en Barro: Mata Ortiz / Mata Ortiz Pottery: Beauty and Survival*, starting **September 15** and continuing **through December 3** in the 2nd level Atrium of the Louise and Claude Rosenberg, Jr., Library and Learning Resource Center.

The exhibition of pottery from the small town of Mata Ortiz, México, is one part of a three-part show featuring artist collaborations. The exhibiting artists have created pottery as a husband and wife team, sometimes incorporating three generations of family members. Their efforts have resulted in an occupation that provides needed earned income and a tremendous sense of pride. Mata Ortiz is located in northern Chihuahua on the remote high plains, a three hour drive south of the U.S. border. The revival of ceramics in Mata Ortiz has matured over the past 25 years, originating as the inspiration of just one man: **Juan Quezada**. Today, Mata Ortiz has a population of some 2,000, perhaps 300 of whom are working potters. Through exhibitions in museums and art galleries in México, the United States, Europe and Japan, this pottery has begun to capture international attention as a fine art expression.

American Studies Department will lecture and lead a discussion on **Tuesday, September 21** on *Monumental Art of the Olmecs*. It will be from 11 A.M. to 1 P.M. in Room 304 of the Rosenberg Library.

Fred Chavaria, Chair, Latin American Studies Department, will present a film and lead a discussion **Thursday, September 30** about *Drug Wars in the Americas*. The time is 11 A.M. to 1 P.M. in Room 305 of the Rosenberg Library.

Haiti: Linking International and Domestic Politics will be the topic of Hatian activist **Pierre La Boissiere** on **Wednesday, October 6** from 9 to 11 A.M. in Room 305 of the Rosenberg Library. He will give a presentation and offer a film.

City College’s Southeast Campus will be the location of **Rosalinda Contreas-Rosado** and the Colombian Ethnic Dance Ensemble on **Wednesday October 6**. Their presentation will be from 11 A.M. to 1 P.M. in the Alex Pitcher Community Room 1800 Oakdale Ave..

A replica of an Olmec Head, San Lorenzo #4, will be dedicated on **Saturday, October 9** in the sunken plaza adjacent to the Diego Rivera Theatre. **Miguel Aleman Velazco**, the popular outgoing governor of the Mexican state of Vera Cruz, will lead the ceremony to place the giant sculpture. The plaza area will be reconfigured to be evocative of **Frida Kahlo’s** garden at Casa Azul, the colonial-style house where Kahlo was born, grew up and later lived with her muralist husband **Diego Rivera** from 1941 until her death at age 47 in 1954. Indiana Quadra, Chair, Career Development and Placement Center, will present a film and lead a discussion on *Women of Hope: Latinas Abriendo Camino*. It will be **Thursday, October 14**

from 12 NOON to 2 P.M. in Room 304 of the Rosenberg Library.

The John Adams Campus will be the site of **Jorge Argueta** and **Juan Felipe Herreera** reading and leading a discussion on *Bilingual Children’s Literature*. It will be from 6 to 7:30 P.M. in Room 202, 1860 Hayes St. (corner of Masonic).

Professor **Greg Landau** of the Music Department will present a film and lead a discussion on *Five Days in March* on **Wednesday, October 20**, 11 A.M. to 3 P.M. in Room 305 of the Rosenberg Library.

Juan Gonzales, Chair of the Journalism Department, will talk about the *State of the Spanish Language Press* **Wednesday October 27**, followed by a discussion. It will begin at 11 A.M. and continue through 1 P.M. in Room 305 of the Rosenberg Library.

For the concluding event, **Kathleen Berrin** will lecture and lead a discussion on *Courtly Art of the Ancient Maya*, an exhibition which she curated for the Legion of Honor Museum. It will be held **Thursday, November 4**, 11 A.M. to 1 P.M. in Room 305 of the Rosenberg Library.

Tina Martin serves on panel awarding scholarships to Women in Technology

Tina Martin, an ESL instructor now on sabbatical leave, served on a Women in Technology Committee in August to help select scholarship winners among 80 Algerian women seeking training in their country through Cisco Networking Academy Scholarships for Women.

Committee members read the 80 applications, each including four short answers to essay questions on motivation, community service, family influences, and the importance of the participation of women in Information Technology. The committee members then rated the applicants on the basis of ability to succeed, financial need, interest in mentoring other females in the field of Information Technology, and their

potential to contribute to the field of Information Technology.

Martin, who taught at a girls' lycee in Medea, Algeria, from 1974 to 1976, said she welcomed the opportunity to put her French to practical use "instead of just annoying French people with it," and expand her vocabulary in the realm of technology. "Most of all," she says, "It gave me a glimpse of the interests and concerns of Algerian women and their advancement since I was teaching them thirty years ago."

Among the others on the committee were **Violetta Cavalli-Sforza**, a Visiting Researcher, Language Technologies Institute, Carnegie Mellon University and **Araceli Hernandez**, a PhD Candidate in the Department of French at the University of California, Berkeley.

IIE will be hosting four more selection committees in late Fall to select applicants for the Women In Technology scholarship program in Morocco. João Barretto's 'Bibliography of Latin Fiction'

João C. Barretto, Acquisitions Librarian and Coordinator of Collection Development, Louise and Claude Rosenberg, Jr., Library and Learning Resource Center, has compiled a Bibliography titled *Latin American Fiction in English Translation*. It is available on the internet at as an Adobe Acrobat PDF at: www.ccsf.edu/Library/latambib.htm

This bibliography is a compilation of Latin American/Caribbean fiction comprising novels and collections of short stories originally published in Spanish or Portuguese which are available in English translation. It is arranged in alphabetical order by Latin American countries. Within each country, authors and their works appear alphabetically. Included are variant editions of the same title which appear in chronological order, as well as bilingual editions. Citations appear in the MLA (Modern Language Association) format and provide information about the author, title, publisher, place of publication and date of publication. A table of contents arranged alphabetically by country precedes the work and a joint author/title index follows it. In order to facilitate differentiating between author and title entries in the index, authors appear in bold caption and titles appear underlined.
