CCSF has been awarded a Fulbright grant to bring a scholar from Bangladesh with expertise in the Muslim World to CCSF.

The scholar, Dr. **Syed Jamil Ahmed**, whose speciality is Islamic Theatre, is scheduled to be in residence at CCSF from October 2 to November 13, 2005.

As a condition of the grant, CCSF must provide FREE housing for Dr. Ahmed. We had secured housing for him, but that housing has fallen through. I am now appealing to one of you out there to open up your home to Dr. Ahmed for six weeks this fall.

his host/hostess, but he should have access to the kitchen. Dr. Ahmed is not a religious man, and therefore does not need special accommodations made for him in terms of dietary needs.

I have gotten to know Dr. Ahmed at length over the last six months via email. He is a very polite, intelligent, sensitive and interesting man. He has studied in England and his English is excellent. I think he would be a very fascinating houseguest.

### Carlota del Portillo named ‘local hero’

KQED-TV, Channel 9, has selected Dr. **Carlota del Portillo**, Dean of the Mission Campus of City College of San Francisco, as a Local Hero for the 2005 Latino Heritage Month programs airing in September. On its website, KQED notes, “She has been involved in education of Latinos for over 35 years and 32 of those years with City College of San Francisco. As Dean of the Mission Campus, she has worked with other Latinos to improve post secondary education access for Latinos. A major accomplishment towards this end was the groundbreaking September 6, 2005 for a permanent home for the Mission Campus of City College at 106 Bartlett Street in San Francisco. Dean del Portillo has been actively working in the Latino community since 1970, with her main emphasis being to facilitate access to education and the job market.

“Dr. del Portillo has exercised major leadership roles in San Francisco City government, having been elected to two terms on the San Francisco Board of Education, serving as President and Vice President. She was appointed by Mayor Feinstein to the Civil Service Commission, serving for ten years. Del Portillo was appointed to the Fire Commission by Mayor Brown and to the Human Rights Commission for terms by

Mayors Moscone and Newsom. She advocated for inclusion of women in the Fire Department during her tenure on the Civil Service Commission

and had the pleasure of welcoming Joann Hayes White, the first female Fire Chief.

“Dr. del Portillo is a member of the Mission Hiring Hall Board of Directors, and the Golden Gate National Park Conservancy and its Education Committee. In collaboration with the community organizations, she has developed vocational training programs that enhance access to the local labor market.

“Dean del Portillo believes deeply that with equitable access to education Latinos will be able to take the first step towards full participation in the workforce and take advantage of the opportunities offered in America. She champions efforts to ensure that children and adults are well-educated to make their contributions to the American institutions of the future.”

## Biology Seminar Series begins with 'Wildlife of Alcatraz'

The Biology Department and the Concert and Lecture Series co-sponsor the Biology Seminar Series which will begin **Friday, September 16** at 12 NOON in Science Building Room 300 with "The Wildlife of Alcatraz." The speaker will be **Christian Hellwig**, Biologist, Alcatraz Island, Golden Gate National Recreation Area.

With the Farallon Islands providing a major home to seabirds in the area, Alcatraz serves as a "backup" to the population should environmental disaster affect them. Humans have altered the environment on the island such that it now provides homes for some birds that may not have originally nested there. Bird species on Alcatraz include western gulls, cormorants, guillemots, night herons, egrets and pelicans. Hellwig will describe how each species has adapted to different niches on the rock. The pelican

seems to have become the symbol for Alcatraz, but the western gull might be a better choice: Gulls often outnumber humans on the rock, defending their historic territories with their lifelong mates. The management problems associated with 1,000 pairs of gulls nesting in such a small area are significant. It is often a challenge to walk the line between visitor convenience and comfort and a hands-off approach to wildlife management. Hellwig will describe the opportunities for and use of volunteer and intern resources in helping to manage and interpret the wildlife resources on Alcatraz.
