## Press conference details Garment Worker Re-Training Program

City College of San Francisco, in partnership with advocacy organizations in the Asian community, organized labor and business, has developed a customizable program to help Chinese speaking workers who have lost their jobs due to massive garment industry layoffs find and keep employment in growing industries. Through the Garment Worker Re-Training Program, CCSF and its partners are providing comprehensive services to 100 limited English proficient, dislocated garment workers for up to 18 months, with the goal of increasing exponentially the number of people served.

“This is the whole package — income support, ESL, Vocational ESL, child care, and transportation. It’s career development customized for every individual we can reach,” said Dr. **Philip R. Day, Jr.**,

CCSF Chancellor at a press conference September 27 at the Chinatown/North Beach Campus.

Dr. Day praised the contributions of many current and former CCSF staff members, including: **Phyllis McGuire**, Associate Vice Chancellor, Office of Workforce and Economic Development; **Suzanne Korey**, Acting Dean of Contract Education; **Sharon Seymour**, Chair, ESL Department; **Warren Mar**, Coordinator for the Dislocated Garment Workers Retraining Program and part-time faculty in the Labor and Community Studies Department; and **Frances Lee**, former Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs and a long-time board member of partner Chinese for Affirmative Action (CAA).

Partnering with CCSF and CAA are the Chinese Progressive Association, the

STEP Program of the San Francisco Labor Council, the Private Industry Council of San Francisco, Inc., the California State Employment Development Department and the federal Trade Adjustment Assistance program.

The project is the result of more than a year’s worth of planning by City College and its partners. Particular attention was paid to training workers for upwardly mobile jobs in growing industries — not employment in another dead end job in a declining industry.

Services available through the Garment Worker Re-Training Program include:

- Income support through the state unemployment insurance benefits and federally funded Trade Adjustment Assistance.

- Vocational English as a Second Language – Upon undergoing a language and vocational skills assessment, participants enroll in classes taught by CCSF instructors specifically designed to develop workplace English and provide students with the industry specific language skills they need to obtain sustainable employment.
- Job training in high growth industries, including hospitality, health care, early childhood development, horticulture/gardening and janitorial/housekeeping. Each student meets with instructors and employment advocates to review their vocational skills

assessments and training options to select a training track that best suits their career goals.

- Job placement services – community and labor based employment advocates with work with employers to place students in sustainable jobs suited to their interests and skills.

The 100 students currently in the program began their studies on August 17.

## State Chancellor awards CCSF \$2.5 million grant to RN program

City College of San Francisco has been awarded \$2.5 million to expand the capacity of its Registered Nursing (RNs) program and increase student retention by providing a set of comprehensive support services over the next five years. This initiative was funded by the California State Chancellor's Office in August with money from the federal government's Workforce Investment Act.

The project is designed to respond to California's growing nursing shortage, a critical issue that threatens to compromise the safety and quality of patient care throughout the state.

CCSF's new grant-funded program will support the work begun in 2004 with a \$4.2 million grant from the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation to build a parallel registered nursing program in partnership with the California Pacific Medical Center featuring classes scheduled in afternoons and evenings.

Together, the two projects will fund an afternoon/evening RN program that will enroll an additional 32 students each semester beyond the program's current capacity. Furthermore, CCSF has designed a set of student support services based on both its own and statewide research on best practices. Students will work with a case manager and a nurse mentor to receive assistance with both academic and personal problems, including tutoring, childcare issues, financial crises. In addition, CCSF will also integrate the use of human patient simulators into the program in order to help students develop the practical knowledge and critical thinking skills so crucial to success in the workplace.

A. Consolidation update: Vice Chancellor Griffin reported that many departments do not at this time meet the criteria for consolidation of positions. FPAC recommends consolidating part-time positions into one new full-time position P.E./Dance and one for Health Science.

B. FPAC recommends that we approve without funding one new position in the Engineering Department for 2006–07.

Resolved,

That the PBC approve one position each by consolidation for P.E./Dance and for Health Science, and

That the PBC approve without funding one new position in Engineering for 2006–07.

#### II. Budget Report

Vice Chancellor Goldstein distributed copies of Exhibit C from the 2004–2005 First Principal Apportionment Report for the SFCCD, and copies of his own budget analysis. He made a full presentation on key budget issues, and these were among his points:

- CCSF received funding for all of our Credit and Noncredit FTES.
- The growth revenue caps had been adjusted because of declining enrollments.

The committee discussed an action plan to review the current draft of the District Communications Plan. The following time line was developed.

Summer 2005 **Martha Lucey** will seek input from Administrators.

Fall 2005 Martha Lucey will report her finding to the Communication Committee. Members of the Communication Committee will seek input from students, staff and faculty groups.

Spring 2006 The committee will revise the document and present it to the College Advisory Council.

The Communications Committee established a work group to facilitate this process

#### *EAtv-Ch27 Update*

The new EAtv-Ch27 Study Group had its first meeting on May 3. The chair of the group is **Tom Blair**.

#### *New Catalog*

The new 70th anniversary edition of the College Catalog will be available May 6th.

#### *Business Card Design Proposal (from Works of Arts Subcommittee)*

The Works of Art Subcommittee presented a proposal to offer a CCSF business card with images of City College art on the backside. Although the Communication Committee was not against the idea, some details have to be worked out before the proposal can be

presented to the CAC. **Julia Bergman**, the chair of the Works of Art Subcommittee was also present at the CAC meeting. She asked for the College's support in the quest to bring CCSF business card with images from the Diego Rivera Mural to our district.

#### *Proposal to Require Posted Flyers in Languages Other than English to Include English Translation*

The spirit of the proposal is to ensure accessibility for all CCSF students to the messages on flyers posted on district property. The committee tabled the proposal until Fall 2005 at which time Dean Fotch will be included in the debate.

#### *ITPC (David Yee)*

David Yee reported on the First Reading of VPN usage policy.

#### *Shared Governance System Recommendations Report (Bob Gabriner)*

CAC member approved draft Flow Chart of Shared Governance System.

CAC members approved the membership composition of the Committee on Information and Public Records. There shall be three representatives from each constituent groups.

Proposed Guidelines for Committee Chairs of Shared Governance System committee was approved by the CAC with one modification on language in the last section.

- The deficit factor as listed is incorrect. The correct factor is ~0.988.
- As of mid-February 2005, our nonresident tuition revenue is down by ~\$800K (for various reasons, including homeland security measures affecting foreign students).
- The costs of fringe benefits (specifically health, dental, and retirement) are rising much faster than overall costs. (Note that some districts are considering denying retirement health benefits to new employees. SFCCD spends ~\$360K/mo on retiree health benefits.)
- The District is faced with the possibility of a very low ending balance. The Chancellor and the Vice Chancellors are considering several ways of increasing that balance.
- The College is also considering using reserves to fund summer school that would create substantial long-term economic benefits.
