Voters elect Dr. Anita Grier, Lawrence Wong and John Rizzo to CCSF Board of Trustees

At the polls on November 7, voters re-elected San Francisco Community College District incumbents Dr. **Anita Grier** and **Lawrence Wong**, Esq., and elected **John Rizzo** to join them on the Board of Trustees.

According to the official results from the San Francisco Department of Elections, with 580 of 580 precincts counted as of December 5, the results were: Dr. **Anita Grier** with 103,125 votes or 25.56% of the total number of votes cast in the election; **Lawrence Wong**, 88,789, or 22.00%; **John Rizzo**, 68,440 or 16.96%; **Johnnie L. Carter, Jr.**, 68,088 or 16.87%; **Bruce Wolf**, 51,343 or 12.72%; **Johnny D. Knadler**, 21,710 or 5.38%. There were 2,024 write-in votes or .50%.

There are 418,285 registered voters in San Francisco and 253,719 cast ballots in the November 7 election, for a voter turnout of 60.66%.

Dr. Anita Grier

Dr. **Anita Grier** was first elected to the Board of Trustees in 1998 and re-elected in 2002 and 2006. She served as President of the Board in 2003 and 2000. She is Chair of the 2007 Board's Diversity Committee and a Member of the Education and Legislative Committees. A graduate of City College of San Francisco, Trustee Grier holds Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts degrees from San Francisco State University and a Doctoral degree from the University of San Francisco.

Lawrence Wong, Esq.

Lawrence Wong, Esq., was first elected to the Board of Trustees in 1994 and re-elected in 1998, 2002 and 2006. He is Chair of the 2006 Board's Facilities Committee and a Member of the

Technology and Education Committees. Trustee Wong is a graduate of City College of San Francisco, the University of California at Berkeley and the University of Santa Clara School of Law.

John Rizzo

John Rizzo is the President of the Sierra Club's San Francisco Bay Chapter, a member of the City College Bond Oversight Committee, and City Commissioner on the Golden Gate Park Concourse Authority.

Rizzo is an author and content publisher in computer technology and enterprise systems. He has taught adult education and written educational materials.

Trustee-elect Rizzo has a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering from Rutgers' University.

Community update Dec. 11 re: status of facilities construction, master plan

City College of San Francisco will hold a community meeting on **Monday, December 11** to update residents on the status of the College's plans, including developments associated with the Mission, Chinatown/North Beach and Ocean Campuses. The meeting will be held from 6 to 8 P.M. in the Student Cafeteria located in Smith Hall on the Ocean Campus, 50 Phelan Ave.

"It has been almost a year from the time last year that we provided the community with a comprehensive overview of the status of our plans (including financial matters) which were a part of the 2001 and 2005 Bond Initiatives, as well as the status of the overall College Master Plan," says Dr. **Philip R. Day, Jr.**, Chancellor.

"The passage of these bonds has created an unprecedented opportunity for City College to build new neighborhood campuses in the Chinatown and Mission Districts as well as renovate older buildings such as the John Adams Campus in the Hayes Valley. Basketball Camp set for winter break
