The theme will be *In Defense of Human Rights: Developing Transnational Latino Movements*. The first two events will have guest filmmakers screening their respective documentaries.

Lourdes Portillo will show *Finding the Sources, Telling the Story: Las Madres de la Plaza de Mayo* on **Thursday, September 27**, from 12 to 2 P.M. in Rosenberg R304, Ocean Campus. Portillo will lead the discussion on the documentary.

Laurie Coyle will screen *Orozco: Man of Fire* on **Monday, October 1** from 7 to 9 P.M. in Rosenberg 304, Ocean Campus. Coyle will lead the discussion following the documentary.

Xochitl Castañeda will lecture about and present the film documentary *Health Initiatives of the Americas Wetback: The Undocumented Documentary* on **Thursday, October 4** from 11 A.M. to 1:30 P.M. in Rosenberg 304 on the Ocean Campus. Castañeda is Project Director to the Health Initiatives of the Americas.

CCSF Latino/a Studies Department Professor **Marco Mojica** and colleague and doctoral candidate **Hector Perla** will participate in a panel discussion on Central American Social Movements in the United States on **Thursday, October 11** from 11 A.M. to 1 P.M. in Rosenberg 304 on the Ocean Campus.

Authors **Piri Thomas** (*Down These Mean Streets: Forty Year Anniversary*) and **Gustavo Arellano** (*Ask A Mexican*) will read from their books and lead discussions.

Arellano will speak **Monday, October 22** from 10 to 11:15 A.M. in Rosenberg 304 on the Ocean Campus; from 12 NOON to 1:15 P.M. in Room 821 on the 8th floor of the Downtown Campus, 88 Fourth Street; and from 6:30 to 8 P.M. at the Mission Campus, 1125 Valencia St.

Librarians offer instant message reference service

This semester CCSF Libraries will be offering an Instant Messaging Reference Service.

Instant Messaging or IM is a real-time, online form of internet communication that is very similar to online chat. Millions of young people use it for their everyday communication. You type a message into a box, and someone else responds right away, if they are online at the same time. AOL, MSN/Hotmail, Google, and Yahoo have their own IM service.

The Library will be using Meebo (<http://www.meebo.com>) that allows us to have one login for all of these. We still have telephone, in-person, and e-mail reference.

This is just another way for students, faculty and staff to communicate with us. If you already have an IM account on MSN/Hotmail, Google, or Yahoo you can use ASKCCSF to contact us. This semester we will be staffing it Monday to Thursday, 9 A.M. to 8 P.M., and Friday, 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. If we don't respond right away, we may be assisting students at the desk. Some of the IM services offer transferring of files and images, conference calls, video connections (webcams), and co-browsing of screens. This may be of particular interest to online faculty and students. Tiffany Dang earns NSEP award to study in China

For the 13th straight year City College of San Francisco has a winner of the NSEP award and this year our student was the only winner from a community college. This year the student is **Tiffany Dang** born in this country not long after her parents fled the Khmer Rouge in Cambodia. Tiffany received nearly \$20,000 to study at Nanjing University and at Beijing University (Beida) in China. She is going to UC Berkeley this semester before leaving for China in the new year. At Berkeley she will study International Relations and Far Eastern Studies and in China, Chinese language, history and culture. She hopes to be fluent after one year in China and four semesters of excellent preparation at City College. She and about 200 others students from all over the United States went to Washington D.C. in June to receive their awards, learn more about the program and visit the historic buildings and museums in D.C.

"We do have many brilliant students at City, says NSEP advisor **Sue Light**, "Just send them to me so that I can package them and show them how to win a competitive scholarship. Since the beginning of the program City College has had 30 winners of \$20,000 to study in countries such as, China, Japan, Korea, Thailand, Vietnam, Costa Rica, Mexico, Argentina, Chile, Egypt, Syria, Croatia, and Morocco. I would like to extend a big thank you to all those faculty who serve on committees, write brilliant letters of recommendation and finally to **Joan Wilson**, who even though now retired from the English Department, still oversees the essays to ensure that our entries are incisive, well-written and focused," said Light.

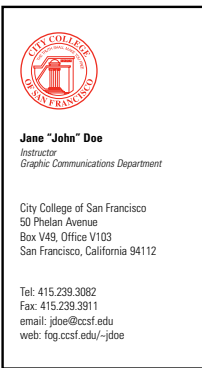
