## Trustees give go-ahead to CH/NB campus

The Board of Trustees of the San Francisco Community College District has passed three resolutions declaring the intention of City College of San Francisco to proceed with the building of a new Chinatown/North Beach Campus.

Meeting October 18 at the current Chinatown/North Beach Campus site

of 940 Filbert Street, the Board took the following actions:

- **Approved Resolution No. 071018-S1** — Adoption of Findings Relating to the Certification of the Final Environmental Impact Report for the Chinatown/North Beach Campus of the San Francisco Community College District, located at

800 Kearny Street, the Northeast Corner of Kearny Street and Washington Street.

- **Approved Resolution No. 071018-S2** — Declaration of Exemption From Zoning Ordinances of the City and County of San Francisco regarding the San Francisco Community College Chinatown/

# Shared Governance Update Planning and Budgeting Council

## Minutes of August 30, 2007 meeting

1. PBC Minutes from 2007 April 25: approved.

2. California State Budget, 2007–2008: Update

Chancellor Day discussed the State Budget and, in particular, Governor Schwarzenegger's veto message.

- The Governor claims that his office did not receive the list of noncredit certificate (CDCP) programs, but the CCC State Chancellor has a receipt for the delivery.
- The Department of Finance opposes basic skills funding unless it entails the CCCs focusing on 18–25 year old students, pay-for-performance criteria, and accountability measures. The CCCs summarily reject the first two, but Dr. Day chaired a meeting of the CCC CEOs and the Department of Finance in which the CCCs proposed accountability measures for which data is readily available.
- The vetoed noncredit funding cannot return without action by the Legislature, and the pundits suspect the Legislature will adjourn early this session.

3. Faculty Position Allocation Committee (FPAC) Requests, Fall 2007

Vice Chancellor Murillo reported that FPAC is accepting requests for consolidation (including some held over from last year), retiree replacements, and sabbatical replacements.

4. Budget Review and Recommendation Process: Update

Vice Chancellor Gabriner disbursed a chart showing the Joint Working Group's (JWG) progress. The JWG has made recommendations on 7 of the 14 units under review; the rest are in progress.

5. Improving the Presentation of the Budget to the Public: Discussion

In response to a WASC recommendation, the College is seeking a way to make the Budget reports, ordinarily somewhat opaque except to an expert, easy for a layperson to use.

- Ideally, a layperson would be able to see where tax money is going, and that the money is well-spent.
- Dr. Day proposed making an appendix out of the many tables, usually the body of the reports. The new report would feature pie charts for revenue and expenditures, explanations of growth and enrollment caps, projections of future changes, and goals.
- The group discussed some ideas for improving the annual planning system in accordance with a WASC recommendation. It was suggested that perhaps we could organize the Annual Plan by division instead of by strategic priority, with metrics added for later evaluation of plan implementation. At the next meeting a more concrete proposal for such improvement will be brought forth for discussion.
- Dr. Day also proposed resuming the Board Budget Retreats. These ceased because the Board exhausted the office's resources with increasing demands for detailed information.

# College Advisory Council

## Minutes of September 6, 2007 meeting

### I. Approval of Minutes

The Council approved the amended May minutes.

### II. Reports from the Committee Chairs

#### A. Communication Committee (Francine Podenski)

The September meeting had only one agenda item, the College's web project. The Communication Committee made the following recommendation for the Council;

- Earthbound Media Group will do the website design
- Sunguard will work with the college on the Luminas Portal Project.

The Council approved the project, which will be presented to the Board of Trustees, at their September 6, worksession and the resolution at their September 27 regular meeting.

#### B. College Diversity Committee (Dr. Alice Murillo)

- The Grow Your Own program has now 22 participants. The committee also reviewed other issues related to the program.
- The Tulay Program was reviewed with a final review in October.
- The Dean of Diversity job description, role and related org. structure is in the process of being reviewed. Members of the CAC wanted to make sure that once the revision(s) is made it will go through the shared governance process.

#### C. Information and Technology Policies Committee (David Yee)

- The ITPC also approved the recommendations of the Web Advisory Subcommittee.

- The replacement of the network switches will take place in Spring of 2008. This could possibly cause a 2-3 hours of power outage in parts of the campus during work hours. This can't be avoided as the IT does not have enough people or overtime to do the job at nights or weekends. Council member asked ITPC to look in to if the job could be scheduled over the winter, spring and summer break.

#### D. Committee on Information and Public Records (Attila Gabor)

The CIPR has not met as the revised "College Sunshine Ordinance Policy" was not provided to the district yet.

### III. Other Business and Announcement

The council asked that Dean Jorge Bell would be invited to give a presentation on the "Timely Processing Financial/Lab Aid Work Study Students.

It was also requested to discuss to give a shared governance presentation to the Board of Trustees.

# Teaching and Learning Technology Roundtable

## Minutes of September 10, 2007 – R518

The meeting was called to order at 2:15 P.M.

**Minutes:** The minutes of the May meeting were approved as submitted. There was a brief discussion on the recent fall in attendance at TLTR meetings. Suggestions to increase attendance included changing the day and time, encouraging individuals to attend, having a meeting that could be accessed remotely, for example, via CCC Confer.

### Old Business

#### Recap of Technology Plan Update: Where do we go from here?

The TLTR will meet with ITS to work out approaches to and a cohesive model for drafting the new technology plan due in March, 2009 (ready to be sent to WASC). The TLTR should finish their portion of the plan in Fall 08. It was suggested that the overall Ed Tech plan could be adjusted to reflect what individual schools have in their individual plans. These plans were part of the Educational Master Plan. Research, Planning, and Grants will be consulted to see if the Educational Master Plan will be revised at this time.

It was reported (in answer to questions at the last meeting about the use of GIS

on campus) that GIS has been used in accessibility mapping on campus. Doug Re will be asked to report on other uses of GIS at a future meeting. It was clarified that timesheets are a "Payroll" dept. issue, not ITS.

### New Business

LCD Projectors used for video playback and accessibility

Suggestions for faculty members using multimedia components in online and tech-enhanced classes

**Tom Hetherington** (DSPS) brought up the need to make sure that classrooms with audio-video equipment such as overhead LCD projectors intended for use with VCR and DVD players be capable of displaying captions for the benefit of deaf and hard of hearing students. This can be accomplished by purchasing LCD projectors with built-in caption decoding capability for new buildings or by purchasing caption decoders for VCR and DVD players in existing buildings. Caption decoders cost about \$200 each and are attached to the back of VHS and DVD players. Currently, instructors who need a decoder can request one from Broadcast Media services.

Tom Hetherington made some suggestions for online and tech-enhanced instructors using computer multimedia components.

At the start of the semester, for example in the orientation, inform students that there will be multimedia elements such as audio, video or interactive components.

Cover the same course material in another format such as text.

In the orientation, encourage students with disabilities to self-identify and contact the DSPS as soon as possible to begin the process of receiving accommodations.

### Upcoming TLTR Meetings:

It was decided to invite Beth Cataldo to the October meeting to give a portal and website redesign update. James Rogers will be invited to the November meeting to report on the Help Desk. The TLTR will ask what the Help Desk needs; software for self-service, more staffing, other functionality. Tech support options for students will also be explored. The change in classroom internet port functionality will be reported in City Currents.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 P.M.

### Endangered Species Act examined

**Kim Tounch**, Professor of Biology at City College, will present an overview of the process of enlisting a species with the Endangered Species Act. Her talk will be held **Friday, November 2** at 12 NOON in Science Room 300 on the Ocean Campus.
