Focus on Graduation

During 1998-1999, 1,084 CCSF students received an associate degree. Of those graduates, 46.5% (504) were Asian/Pacific Islander, 19.7% (214) white, 11.6% (126) Latino/Hispanic, 8.4% (91) African-American and 7.7% (84) Filipino.

Additionally, nearly three-quarters of all degree recipients from that year took at least one basic skills course while enrolled at CCSF.
