

## Sources and Methods

### Section I: Internal Scan of CCSF

Most data from the internal section comes, indirectly from the CCSF Banner Student database (Spring 1998 to present) and the CCSF ISIS database (terms prior to Spring 1998). The Office of Research, Planning & Grants retrieves data from these systems and configures it into aggregated information.
