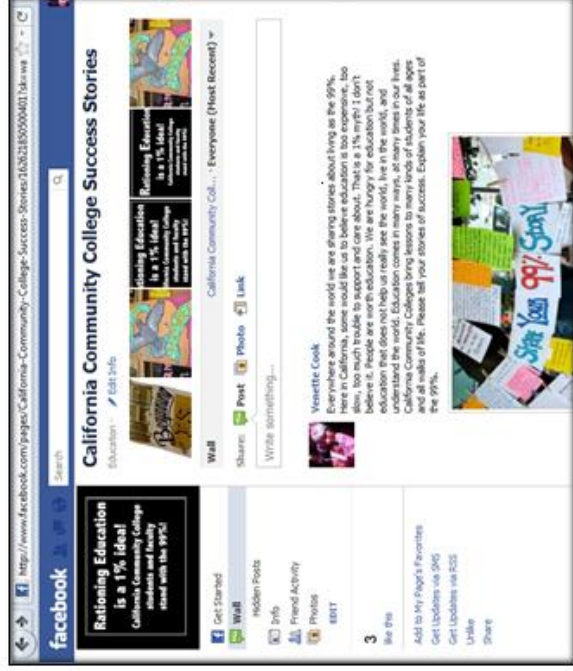

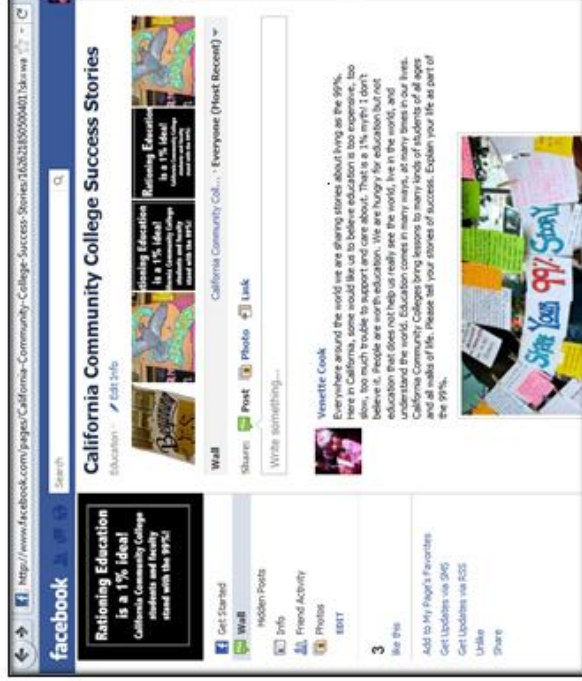

The recommendations of the Student "Success" Task Force would significantly change the mission of California's 112 community colleges. 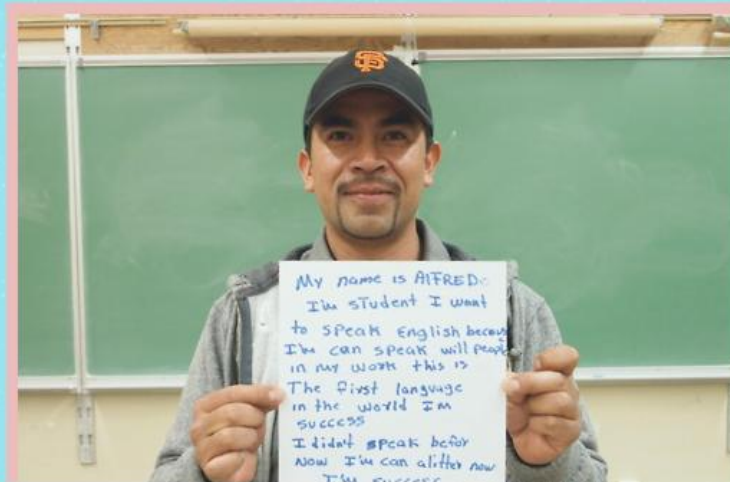
