Board of Trustees to vote on June 22

SAN FRANCISCO – City College of San Francisco (CCSF) is pleased to announce that it has selected Dr. Mark Rocha as the lead candidate for chancellor at CCSF. The board will vote on his contract in open session on Thursday, June 22, and if ratified, Dr. Rocha would assume District leadership on July 1.

"We are impressed with Dr. Rocha's qualifications and experience in higher education," said Thea Selby, President of the Board of Trustees. "Throughout the open forums and search process, Dr. Rocha consistently received high rankings from our constituency groups, particularly our students."

Dr. Rocha most recently worked as the Senior Program Manager in the New York Governor's Office of Storm Recovery (GOSR). He previously served as Superintendent and President of Pasadena City College, as President at West Los Angeles College, and as Associate Dean and tenured faculty at Cal State Northridge. Dr. Rocha received a Ph.D. in English from the University of Southern California, an M.S. in Engineering from California State University, Fullerton, and a bachelor's degree from Villanova University.
