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Facilities planning is underway!

CCSF is developing a new Facilities Master Plan (FMP) to guide facilities development for the next decade. The FMP 2017-2027 will provide a roadmap supporting the goals and strategies of the College’s Education Master Plan. The Capital Projects and Planning Committee (CPPC) will guide plan development, based on the following process:

- NEEDS - Analyze existing facilities and identify needs
- OPTIONS - Consider a variety of options based on these needs
- RECOMMENDATION - Develop a recommended solution addressing needs

Faculty, staff, students, administrators, community groups and the public have opportunities to provide input at each step in the planning process.

- RECOMMENDATION - Comments on Draft FMP Jan-Feb 2017

The Grants & Resource Development Office offers help with all phases of proposal development for those seeking alternative resources for innovative programming and services that support fulfilling CCSF's mission and the EMP.

- City College of San Francisco (CCSF) received a \$6 million grant from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office to implement the California Career Pathways Trust (CCPT) project. CCSF's role is to lead a consortium of organizations in strengthening ICT and Biotech programs. Outcomes include increasing enrollment, particularly from underrepresented populations, creating additional work-based experiences for students, and ensuring access for students who are currently in high school and upon graduation.
