<b>Joint authors</b> Last name of author, First name and First and Last name of 2 <sup>nd</sup> author. <i>Title</i> . City: Publisher, Date. Medium. <b>Newspapers, Magazines or Scholarly Journals (Print Sources Only)</b>	
<b>Weekly / monthly magazine article</b> Author. "Title of Article." <i>Magazine Name</i> Date: pages. Medium.	Grossman, Lev. "Invention of the Year: The iPhone." <i>Time</i> 12 Nov. 2007: 60. Print.
<b>Scholarly journal article</b> Author. "Title of Article." <i>Journal Name</i> Volume number. Issue number (Year): pages. Medium.	Fialkoff, Francine. "Rampant Plagiarism: Librarians Must Teach How to Use Information Honestly." <i>Library Journal</i> 127.5 (2002): 70. Print.
<b>Newspaper article</b> Author. "Title of Article." <i>Newspaper Name</i> Date, Edition (if available): Section Page. Medium.	Cohen, Noam. "After False Claim, Wikipedia to Check Degrees." <i>New York Times</i> 12 Mar. 2007, West Coast ed.: C8. Print.

## Web Sites and Web Pages/Documents

Provide each of the following elements as available:

1. Name of author (Last name, First Name) or Name of Organization.
2. "Title of Article"
3. *Name of Web Site*.
4. Date of publication or last update,
5. Name of any Sponsoring Organization
6. Medium.
7. Last date you accessed the web site. (day Mon. year)
8. <URL of website in angle brackets>.

**(URL is not required but suggested when citation information does not easily lead readers to the source OR check with your instructor. )**

**Examples of page/document on a web site: (with author and date AND no personal author and no date)**

## Articles from Periodical & Reference Databases

Provide each of the following elements as available:

1. Name of author (Last name, First Name).
2. "Title of the Article."
3. *Name of Magazine, Journal or Newspaper*
4. Date of publication:
  - a. Day Mon. year: page number. **OR**
  - b. Volume. Issue Number (Year): page number.
5. *Name of the Database Used*.
6. Medium.
7. Last date item accessed (day Mon. year)

**Note:**

- 1) Double-space all lines. Indent one-half inch after the first line. Examples provided on this handout are single-spaced to save space.
- 2) A Works Cited list must be arranged in alphabetical order by author or by title, if author's name is unavailable. Do not divide list by type or format of item.
