

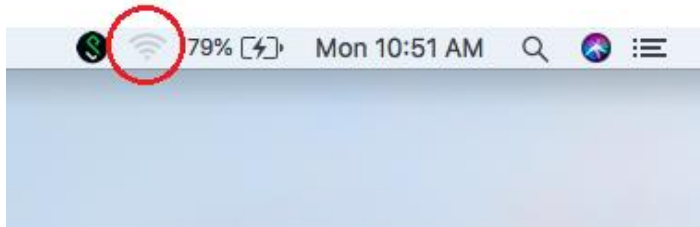

How to Connect OS X [High Sierra] to the CCSF Wireless Network

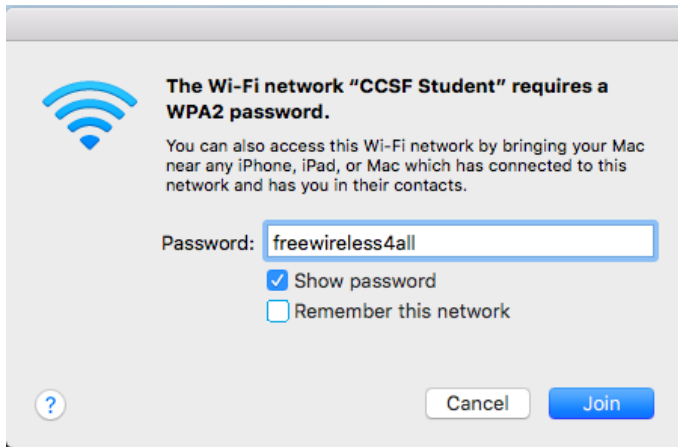
1. These directions are for OS X: High Sierra. Other versions of the Mac OS may differ.
2. This assumes your computer is located where you can get a signal from the CCSF Wireless Network and your wireless card is connected and operational.
3. Click on the Wireless Network Connection icon on the upper right-hand corner of the task bar.



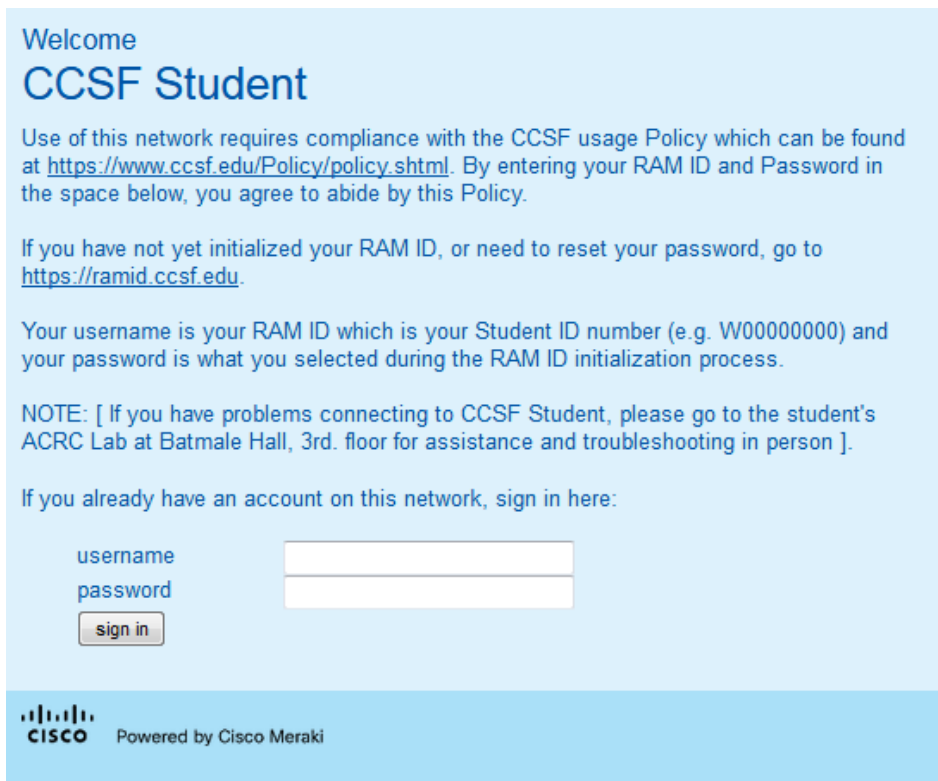
4. Select the CCSF Student (or CCSF Staff).



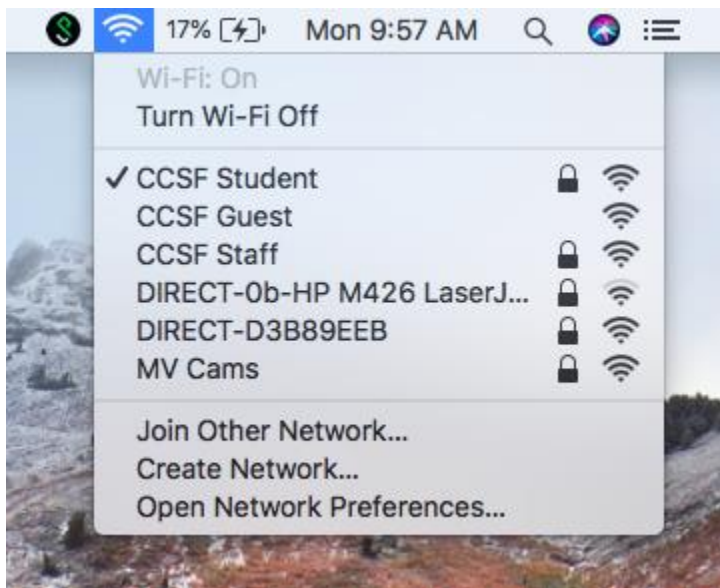
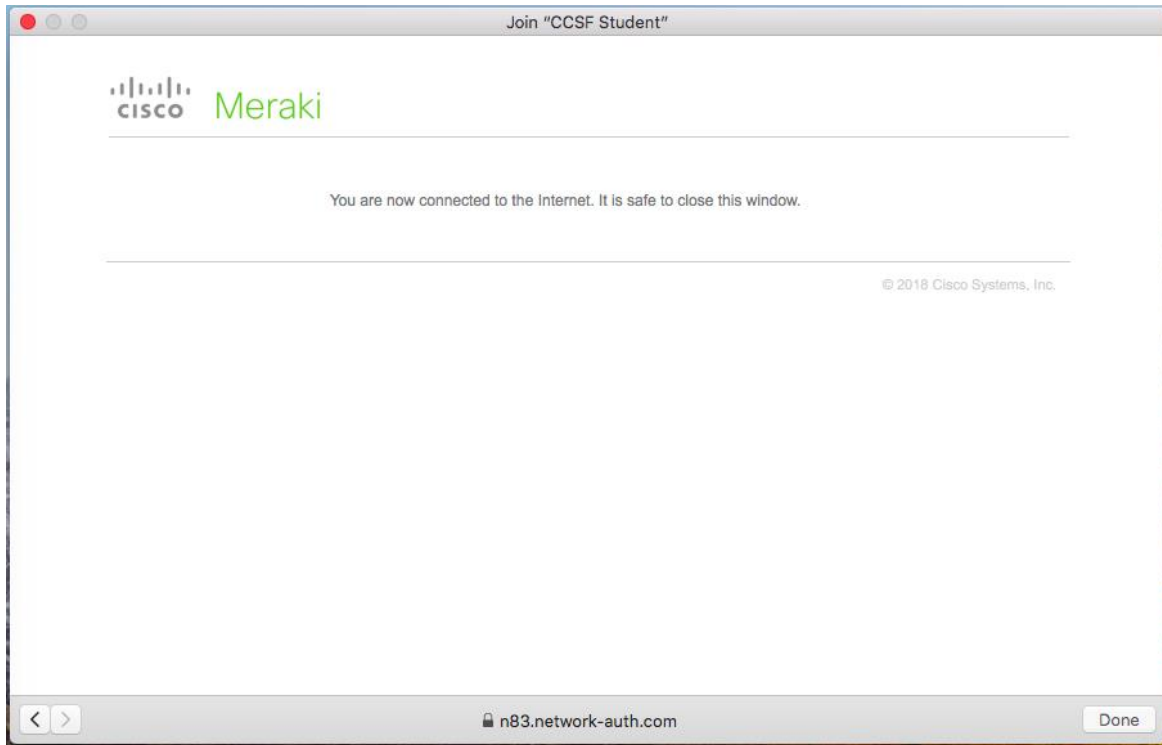
5. You will be prompted to enter a network key to join the selected connection. Check Show password. Then type in the WPA key “freewireless4all” in the Password: field, and click the OK button.



6. Next, you will be prompted to login into our Wireless service. At the screen below, enter in your RAM ID **Username** [e.g. W00000000 or @00000000 for students], or [jsmith for staff] and your RAM ID **Password**. If you do not remember your RAM ID password, please use the Forgot Password feature.



7. Your computer might take a moment to connect to the CCSF Wireless network. If you see a checked mark right next to CCSF Student (or CCSF Staff), your Mac OS X should now be able to get on to the Internet through the Wireless network.
