



CONSTITUTION

This constitution was approved by the student body of Phelan Campus
in the General Elections of Fall 1993

Preamble

We, as students of City College of San Francisco (CCSF) in cooperation with the Board of Trustees of the San Francisco Community College District (the District), do hereby establish this constitution in order to represent, empower, and enable the promotion, growth, and development of the Associated Students.

Article I: Name and Membership

The name of this association shall be the Associated Students of City College of San Francisco (the ASCCSF). Membership in this association is automatically conferred upon any student currently registered in the San Francisco Community College District.

Article II: Executive Board

- Section A: The Executive Board is composed of two members from each campus appointed by the Student Council at each campus.
- Section B: The purpose of the Executive Board is to act as the representative body for all CCSF campuses to facilitate communication, leadership, and advocacy.
- Section C: Recognition of CCSF campuses at the Executive Board requires the attachment of ratified by-laws to this constitution by each campus.
- Section D: The Executive Board shall be governed by its own set of by-laws subject to approval by the Student Councils of each participating campus.
- Section E: The Executive Board shall hold at least two regular meetings per semester, to be convened by the Phelan Campus Representatives or by such Representative as the Board deems appropriate, and at such times as deemed necessary by the Board pursuant to its by-laws.

Article III: Campus Autonomy

- Section A: Each campus may adopt by-laws to govern itself in the manner described in this Article. Such by-laws shall be consistent with this Constitution.
- Section B: Each campus' by-laws shall provide for a student council representing the students at that campus. Such councils shall meet regularly at well-noticed open and public meetings, be responsible for student activities at that campus, provide for representation at Executive Board meetings and all other college-wide forums, and

be bound by the Guidelines for the Management of Associated Students Funds at CCSE.

Section C: By-laws for each campus must be ratified by the students at the campus. Upon ratification, those by-laws shall govern student body activities at that campus.

Section D: No campus by-laws, nor any action of any campus Student Council acting pursuant to its by-laws, may interfere with the by-laws, actions, or activities of any other campus.

Article IV: Amendment

Section A: Amendments to this constitution must be approved by a 2/3 vote of all the campus student councils.

Section B: This constitution and any by-laws adopted at each campus shall be filed with the Dean of Student Activities or such other official designated by the District.
