PHARMACY TECHNICIAN

FOR ACCEPTANCE IN 2025 FALL SEMESTER

Clinical practice in community-based pharmacies or healthcare institutions. Online pharmacy theory classes with in-person practice labs.

The Pharmacy Technician Program is a two-semester course (total 34 units) consisting of online didactic and in-person laboratory. Students will learn the role and function of pharmacy technicians. The laboratory experience is in a simulated environment where students will gain practical experience. A clinical practice externship, working alongside pharmacy professionals in two 120-hour clinical rotations in an actual licensed pharmacy is also included.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. 18 years of age or older.
- 2. An official high school transcript indicating graduated or G.E.D.
- 3. A 2.0 grade point average (GPA) on prior college or high school transcripts is advised.
- 4. An individual orientation.

Upon Acceptance:

- 5. A physical examination and proof of immunity for specified communicable diseases.
- 6. Background check and drug screening after acceptance into the program, but prior to clinical externship

Intermediate Algebra, Eligibility for College Level English, and COREQ: PHTC 102

5 STEPS COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCEDURES

- **1.** Apply for Admission: Go to <u>Admissions & Registration</u> or call 415-239-3285.
 - NEW CREDIT STUDENTS: Fill out a CCSF <u>credit</u> application at <u>Credit Admission</u> or call 415-239-3285
 - RETURNING STUDENTS: Have attended CCSF before as a <u>credit</u> student, but have not enrolled in courses for 2 consecutive semesters (Spring & Fall) or more, reapply (update your personal information) at <u>Credit Admissions</u>. Go to step 3. If you have only been away for one semester, you are considered a <u>Continuing Student</u>.
- 2. Complete the Assessment: Go to <u>Assessment Center</u> or call 415-239-3751.
 - PLACEMENT PROCEDURES FOR NATIVE ENGLISH AND MATH
 Complete online "High School Data Form" for English and Math placemen
 - Complete online "<u>High School Data Form</u>" for English and Math placement by self-reported high school grade point average, and high school coursework.
 - Complete "<u>College and/or Test Data Form</u>" for English and Math placement by prior college-level English and Math course work or standardized tests (SAT, AP Exams, GRE).
 FOR ENGLISH AS SECOND LANGUAGE PLACEMENT: Go to "<u>Credit ESL Placement Test</u>" page (Search) at www.ccsf.edu for two-part remote testing.
 - Complete "Online ESL Guided Placement Tool" (Part I) and CCSF Testing will contact student to arrange for remote ESL writing test (Part II). Results will be evaluated by ESL faculty and ESL placement made.
- **3.** Attend an orientation for the health program of interest. After orientation if there are no questions about registration, tuition & fees, financial aid, or other student services go to step 5.
- **4.** Meet with a CCSF Counselor (Counselors available at John Adams Center for Zoom counseling appointments, call 415-561-1925.)
- 5. Register for Classes: Go to Online Schedule.
