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#### **MEMORANDUM**

RE: Fall 2022 Schedule Development

DATE: February 2, 2022

It is time to begin the process of developing the Fall 2022 schedule of classes. The production of the schedule of classes is one of the largest collaborative efforts undertaken by the College, and I am very appreciative of the collective effort taken by all of you and by the other members of the College community in this work.

In this memo I would like to emphasize a few important notes. Please take a few minutes to read through this memo carefully. Deans should take time in the next few days to discuss the content of this memo with their department chairs.

**Initial Instructional Budgets, FTES Goals, and Consultation**. Initial instructional budgets and FTES goals are attached to this memo.

As Chancellor Martin has noted in his communication earlier today, as part of the budget development process for next year the College is planning to take to the Board of Trustees a resolution to issue approximately fifty March 15<sup>th</sup> notices to full-time faculty. Initial instructional budgets have been developed based on that plan.

Most departments will see initial instructional budgets that align with what they received for Fall 2021 and Spring 2022. There are some departments that will be getting lower initial instructional budgets, commensurate with the plan to issue March 15<sup>th</sup> notices.

Velma Quan will soon be reaching out to those department chairs that have reduced initial instructional budgets to schedule meetings with me, the department chair, and the supervising dean. The purpose of this meeting it for us to review the impact of these initial budgets, carefully and collectively. While not required, I am also happy to meet with department chairs whose instructional budgets are unchanged from Fall 2021/Spring 2022 to discuss any concerns you may have – contact Velma to set up a meeting.

As with prior years, initial instructional budgets have been established for both Fall 2022 and Spring 2023. Departments offering both credit and noncredit instruction have separate budgets for each mode.

Department chairs wishing to shift budget between these areas (Fall/Spring, Credit/Noncredit, Disciplines) should discuss this with their supervising Dean. Deans supporting such a shift shall bring these to me for approval.

A separate budget has been established for classes offered in conjunction with SFUSD. Dean Meg Hudson will be in touch with departments to discuss the use of that budget and specific instructional requests from SFUSD.

The College will once again leverage funds from AEP and SWP to help fund classes. This augmentation has already been factored into instructional budgets.

**Initial Noninstructional Budgets**. Initial noninstructional budgets for *selected* areas are also attached to this memo. Please note that these initial budgets are intended to cover those departments within Academic Affairs where noninstructional assignments have a significant impact on faculty assignments. Additional noninstructional budgets will be developed for other areas of the College as overall College budget development continues.

**In-Person and Online/Remote Instruction**. Based on the implementation of the College's COVID vaccine mandate, we will follow the CDC's guidance for fully vaccinated institutions and drop the physical distancing requirement effective Summer 2022. Mask requirements will remain in place. Departments are encouraged to schedule in-person classes, and those classes should use normal class capacities. Departments scheduling in-person classes will *not* need to file a Return to Campus plan.

Departments may still offer classes in Fall 2022 based on the approval of temporary distance education addenda; however, departments are strongly encouraged to focus online offerings to those classes and instructors that have completed the IOTL/AOTL training.

The Governor's January Budget sets an expectation that community colleges will offer at least 50% of their classes in-person, and while that expectation is not yet a requirement, it is a goal we should strive for.

Of course, we will continue to monitor the public health situation and make adjustments as needed.

**Academic Calendar**. Please refer to the <u>AY 2022-23 academic calendar</u> when making your scheduling choices. In particular, if you are scheduling shorter-term classes, please note the various parts of term (e.g., 1<sup>st</sup> half, 2<sup>nd</sup> half, 6-week, etc.).

**Final Thoughts**. As I mentioned at the beginning of this memo, I am grateful for the work that each of you is going to be doing as part of the schedule development process. I know that many of you will be faced with making difficult decisions and having difficult conversations with your colleagues. The College's budget situation poses great challenges, but I remain optimistic that we will be able to find a path to stability and sustainability.
