1. Call to Order 2:33

President Miraglia read the land acknowledgement:

We acknowledge that we are on the unceded, ancestral homeland of the Ramaytush Ohlone who are the original inhabitants of the San Francisco Peninsula. As the indigenous stewards of this land and in accordance with their traditions, the Ramaytush Ohlone have never ceded, lost nor forgotten their responsibilities as the caretakers of this place, as well as for all peoples who reside in their traditional territory. As guests, we recognize that we benefit from living and working on their traditional homeland. We wish to pay our respects by acknowledging the ancestors, elders, and relatives of the Ramaytush Community and by affirming their sovereign rights as First Peoples.

 - a. Abigail Bornstein: Shared frustrations with lack of public messaging about the recent ACCJC warning letter and the role of the Board of Trustees, despite the hard work that lead to success on 116 of 119 accreditation requirements.
 - b. Monica Bosson: Commented about the absence of the Final Exam date in the Simple Syllabus template. Expressed additional support for the college to say something about the accreditation warning letter.
 - c. Harry Berstein: Requested the Chancellor share what specific actions are taking place in Spring 2024 to improve enrollment at the college.

b. Adopt new Catalog Rights language as recommended by Ed Policies Committee

Interim Associate Dean Monika Liu presented updated Catalog Rights language. The Council offered a few suggestions:

- 2. Adding "certificate" language in all references to degrees, including the asterisk.
- 3. Instead of "course work" the language should refer to "credit coursework."

c. Generative AI and Student Conduct

Dean Amy Coffey and Associate Dean Jen Kienzle<u>shared a presentation</u> and led a discussion with the Council about student conduct challenges assessing a student's use of generative AI. The Council asked the TLTR to develop options for model syllabus policy.

ASEC meeting modality and Council membership President Miralgia led a discussion about the meeting modality for the 2024-25 Executive Council and if we should enforce Article VIII from the By-Laws about members who miss 4 or more meetings in a semester. The Council asked for the motion to come back to the next meeting.
- e. 2024 ASEC Elections Update and <u>proposed Spring Election Calendar</u> Joe Reyes, AS Election Commissioner, introduced the proposed Spring Election calendar and asked for the Council's endorsement.
