Resolutions

Draft Resolution - Non-Credit in CVC (State-Wide Resolution)

Whereas, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) has charged the California Virtual Campus (CVC) with ensuring that significantly more students are able to complete their educational goals by increasing both access to and success in high-quality online courses; and

Whereas, the CVC lists in its Exchange noncredit courses only under somewhat restrictive circumstances and does not provide an adequate subject-based filter to select noncredit courses from its offerings; and

Whereas the CCCCO emphasizes not only degree and certificate completion for all students, including career development and college preparation (CDCP) certificates in noncredit, but also providing access to students of diverse backgrounds; therefore be it

Resolved that the Academic Senate for California Community College (ASCCC) work with the CCCCO and other appropriate higher ed partners with the goal of having the CVC include noncredit courses from both Home and Teaching colleges, regardless of how the noncredit courses are coded, and with an adequate subject-based filter so students can more easily search for noncredit offerings, especially ones whose subject is ESL.
