**CITY COLLEGE OF SAN FRANCISCO AND AFT 2121 SIGN
TENTATIVE LABOR AGREEMENT**

Three-year contract moves current salaries to median of Bay 10 by year three

SAN FRANCISCO – Today, City College of San Francisco and the American Federation of Teachers Local 2121 announced that they have reached a tentative labor agreement, which will provide approximately \$9 million in salary increases over the next three years. Pending ratification by AFT membership and the City College Board of Trustees, this will bring both full and part-time faculty salaries in line with those of other colleges in the region.

“We sat down at the negotiating table with the same goal in mind: to work together to bring our faculty salaries to the median of the Bay10 community colleges within the next three years,” said Dianna Gonzales, Vice Chancellor of Human Resources at City College, the CCSF chief negotiator. “The labor contract also represents the parties’ ongoing commitment to work together to foster an environment consistent with the Board’s Core Values, including developing a sustainable path to 32,000 FTES.”

Brigitte Davila, President of the City College Board of Trustees, said “This most recent round of negotiations signals a new era of labor management partnership at City College, and we look forward to continuing this relationship in the years to come.”

“We thank all of our faculty colleagues of AFT 2121 and stand with them in their dedication to our students,” said City College Chancellor Mark Rocha.

"This is a great moment for AFT and the District," said AFT Local 2121 President Tim Killikelly.



AFT 2121 will present the Tentative Agreement to their membership to ratify, which will then go to the City College Board of Trustees for a vote on May 17.
