In addition, up to 20 various hours weekly clinical practice in community based pharmacies or healthcare institutions

The Pharmacy Technician Program is two-semester course (**total 30 units**) consisting of didactic and laboratory. In the classroom, students will learn the role and function of pharmacy technicians. The laboratory experience is in a simulated environment where students will gain practical experience working alongside pharmacy professionals in two 120-hours clinical rotations in an actual licensed pharmacy.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

1. 18 years of age or older
2. An official high school transcript indicating graduated or G.E.D.
3. A 2.0 grade point average (GPA) on prior college or high school transcripts is advised.
4. An individual orientation

Upon Acceptance:

5. A physical examination and proof of immunity for specified communicable diseases
6. **Background check and drug screening after acceptance into the program, but prior to clinical externship experience**

PREFERRED OR COMPLETED COURSES/EXPERIENCE/PLACEMENT:

PREREQ: MATH 40; ENGL 95 or ENGL 88 or ENGL 88A

or placement in ENGL 96 or ENGL 88B (within the last 5 years) ; COREQ: PHTC 102

ORIENTATION AND COUNSELING

All applicants must attend an orientation. You must bring ONE of the following documents with you:

1. Copy of your CCSF transcript and/or Placement Test results or Placement Testing Waiver form
2. Copy of your college transcript or diploma indicating an award of an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree or higher
3. Copy of high school diploma

Orientation is held at the **John Adams Center, 1860 Hayes Street** on the following dates. It lasts approximately one (1) hour. To be followed by general counseling.

COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCEDURES

All **NEW** and **RE-ADMIT** students (those who have been away from CCSF for one academic year or more previous to the coming semester) need to submit an admission application. **5 Easy Steps** to becoming a CCSF Student:

2. Complete the Assessment and Placement (Testing Office 415-239-3128)
3. Attend a New Student Orientation; special orientations are required for Nursing and Allied Health programs
4. Meet with a Counselor (Counseling Office at John Adams Center 415-561-1925)
5. Register for Classes

ASSESSMENT AND PLACEMENT

California law AB705 represents a significant change in the way students are placed. Students may be eligible to enroll in transfer-level math or English classes with additional support. Students may receive English and Math course placements using high school performance data.

Students can complete assessment using one of the options below:

- High school data (www.ccsf.edu/AB705)
- College data and/or SAT, ACT, AP scores, etc. (www.ccsf.edu/waiver)
- Prerequisite challenge (www.ccsf.edu/prereqchallenge)

Exemptions to the City College Placement Test(s) are as follows:

1. Interested in a class without math and/or English prerequisites.
Check "Exemption from Matriculation" box in credit application.
2. Already have an associate degree or higher from a U.S. accredited school.
3. Completed a college-level math and/or English 1A equivalent course.

To apply for placement testing waiver, bring a copy of your college transcript to Ocean Campus, (50 **Frida Kahlo Way**), Matriculation Office, Conlan Hall Room 204, or John Adams Center, Student Services Office, Room 143 for assistance.

**To receive an earlier registration date –
complete assessment, attend an orientation, and see a counselor to get an education plan!**
