Content includes a focus on Adult Cardiac Ultrasound (Echocardiography): cardiac anatomy and physiology, 2D and M-Mode imaging, PW, CW and color flow Doppler, cardiac pathology and methods of interpretation. CVT course content includes: advanced rhythm interpretation, exercise stress testing, cardiac pharmacology, physics of ultrasound.

# Students MUST enroll in both CVT and ECHO courses each semester:

Students must take all of courses in sequence within the two-year program. Refer to the CVT/ECHO program packet for details about the program.

  - BIO 106 (formerly ANAT 14) or BIO 108 (formerly ANAT 25) with a grade of "C" or higher
- \*Anatomy must be completed by the December before the application process. See information packet for additional requirements.
- 2. Completion of ENGL 96 or **ENGL 88 or ENGL 88B** or ESL 160 or placement in ENGL 1A. An AA/AS or bachelor's degree fulfills this requirement.
- 3. Individual orientation will be part of application process.
