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HEALTH INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (HIT)

The Health Information Technology (HIT) program provides instruction and professional practice experience in the management and quality of health data relating to medical records. Health information professionals are responsible for maintaining components of health information systems consistent with medical, administrative, ethical, legal, regulatory and accreditation requirements of a health care delivery system.

PROGRAM RECOMMENDED PREPARATION:

- Strongly recommended for success in the HIT program: ENGL 88 or ESL 186 or placement in ESL 188 or readiness for college-level English.
- Recommended Prep: Placement into Math 40 or higher

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: 18 years of age minimum

CERTIFICATION OR DEGREE: The program offers an Associate in Science degree in Health Information Technology (HIT). Successful graduates of the degree curricula are eligible to take the national certification examination given by the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA). Successful candidates earn the credential of Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT). Certificate programs are also available for prospective employment as HIT Clerk I and HIT Clerk II, HIT Coding Specialist, and HIT Technician.
