Courses Approved for Certification of IGETC for Transfer to California State University and University of California AUGUST 2014 - JULY 2015 ONLY

Completion of all the requirements in the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) will permit a student to transfer from a community college to a campus in either the California State University or the University of California system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements.

Check with your counselor to determine if you may use IGETC or if you must follow the UC campus specific requirements for your particular major. There may be some limitations on transferable credit, particularly with UC. Check www.assist.org, UC Transferable Courses, for more information on credit limitations.

ALL courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. While some courses are listed in more than one area, they can be certified for **ONE** only, with the exception of Area 6 Language Other Than English.

To use courses taken at other colleges to meet IGETC requirements, check with your counselor. Advanced Placement (AP) test credit may also be applied to IGETC (see chart on back).

3. Satisfactory score in the SAT II: Subject Test in languages other than English. (See current CCSF catalog, Transfer Information section, for required scores.)
4. Score of 3 or better on the College Board Advanced Placement (AP) Exams in languages other than English.
5. Score of 5 or higher on the International Baccalaureate (IB) Higher Level Exams in languages other than English.
6. Satisfactory completion of a proficiency test administered by a community college, university or other college in a language other than English.
7. Completion, with "C" grades or better, of two years of formal schooling at the sixth grade level or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English. Appropriate documentation of attendance at the secondary school must be presented to CCSF Admissions Office.
8. A score of 5, 6, or 7 on international A level exam or grade of A, B, or C on O level exam in a language other than English.
9. Competency verified by California Community College instructor if appropriate proficiency test is not available.

Note: # 9 should be used only if #1-8 are not viable options for demonstrating language proficiency.

CSU Only: US History, Constitution and American Ideals (not required for IGETC, but may be used to satisfy IGETC Areas)
