Courses Approved for Certification of IGETC for Transfer to California State University and University of California AUGUST 2014 - JULY 2015 ONLY

Completion of all the requirements in the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) will permit a student to transfer from a community college to a campus in either the California State University or the University of California system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements.

Check with your counselor to determine if you may use IGETC or if you must follow the UC campus specific requirements for your particular major. There may be some limitations on transferable credit, particularly with UC. Check <a href="https://www.assist.org">www.assist.org</a>, UC Transferable Courses, for more information on credit limitations.

ALL courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. While some courses are listed in more than one area, they can be certified for **ONE** only, with the exception of Area 6 Language Other Than English.

To use courses taken at other colleges to meet IGETC requirements, check with your counselor. Advanced Placement (AP) test credit may also be applied to IGETC (see chart on back).
