Please note that differences between numbers reported this year and last year are due to using the CCCCO Student Success Metrics (SSM) Dashboard this year (except for course completion numbers, which are our local numbers pulled directly from Banner via Argos).

Note re. Questions 6-8: total headcount in all cases (headcount, degree applicable, distance ed) is for Fall terms 2016, 2017, and 2018 per the getting started instructions and input form (not annual as appears in the review screen).

Note re. Question 12: Course completion is for Fall term from local Argos source.

Note re. Question 13: Certificate numbers are based on the unduplicated number of students (not total awards); we did not have a stretch goal until April 2019. We are concerned that the SSM Dashboard figure for FY17/18 is low and should be closer to 773. We are investigating and may need to amend and resubmit.

Note re. Question 14: AA/AS numbers are (largely) unduplicated number of students earning AA/AS but with ADT included; we did not have stretch goal until April 2019. As with Q 13, we are concerned that the SSM Dashboard figure for FY17/18 is low (in this case should be closer to 1250). We are investigating and may need to amend and resubmit.

Note re. Question 16: We had no stretch goal for transfer until April 2019; stretch goal was set primarily in reference to the UC/CSU transfer subtotal (1,651 in 2015-16 and 1,574 in 2016-17) to align with Vision for Success goal setting.

Note re. Question 16.b: The FY 17/18 figure is an estimate based on median time to degree of 4 years. The CCCCO Student Success Metrics Dashboard data are not yet available.

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Note re. Question 17 (Licensure Pass Rates): Students in Dental Assisting are now required to pass only one exam (we have included one pass rate for both the previous written and law/ethnics lines).

Note that the 0% figure in 2015-16 for CVT/Echocardiography should be blank (the system only allows us to enter a number, so we entered 0); this is due to the fact that students only complete the program every two years.

2015-16 and 2016-17 licensure pass rates are unknown for Certified Coding Specialist and Certified Professional Code (as noted above, the system only allows us to enter a number, so we entered 0).

We are monitoring the cases in which the licensure pass rate has declined and has fallen below the institution-set standard. Last year, we reported that we were monitoring EMT and Health Information Tech due to declines in those licensure pass rates, both of which are improving (and Health Information Tech now exceeds the institution-set standard again).

Note re. Question 18 (Job Placement Rates): We are reporting fewer programs than last year. Criteria for including programs are (1) there are at least 10 completers at CCSF and (2) at least 6 students responded to the survey. We used the same criteria last year, and a number of those programs were just barely at those thresholds.

Programs that have met the institution-set standard after reported declines last year include Digital Media, Computer Infrastructure and Support, Nutrition/Foods/Culinary Arts, and Administration of Justice. We are monitoring the cases in which the job placement rate has been trending downward and has fallen below the institution-set standard and continue to monitor those that are trending upward but not yet reaching the institution-set standard.
