

Internal Audit Report on Full-Time and Part-Time Faculty Salaries and Benefits

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Executive Summary

This report provides detailed salary information about full-time and part-time faculty at CCSF in the current and prior fiscal years.

Internal Audit noted the following:

- 1. There was a slight decrease in the count of full-time and part-time faculty paid from last fiscal year to the current year. During fiscal year 2019-2020, CCSF had 565 paid full-time faculty, and 548 in fiscal year 2020-2021 up to February 2021. During fiscal year 2019-2020, CCSF had 944 paid part-time faculty, and 935 during fiscal year 2020-2021 up to February 2021.
- 2. In fiscal year 2019-2020, full-time faculty salaries paid were \$61,434,267; benefits were \$13,943,020, or an additional 22.7%, for a total of \$75,377,287. For fiscal year 2020-2021 as of February 2021, salaries paid were \$41,017,851; benefits were \$13,206,816, or an additional 32.2%, for a total of \$54,224,667.
- 3. In fiscal year 2019-2020, part-time faculty salaries paid were \$24,466,521; benefits were \$3,874,701, or an additional 15.8%, for a total of \$28,341,222. For fiscal year 2020-2021 as of February 2021, salaries paid were \$12,521,531; benefits were \$2,932,321, or an additional 23.4%, for a total of \$15,453,852.
- 4. For full-time faculty, regular pay is 95% of earnings. Leave pay is 5% of earnings paid. All other categories of earnings are less than 1%.
- 5. For part-time faculty, regular pay is 98% of earnings. Office hours pay is 1% of earnings. Substitute pay is 1% of earnings.
- Unlike at most California community colleges, part-time faculty who meet certain criteria receive health benefits, costing \$1,753,287 in fiscal year 2019-2020, and \$1,515,146 in fiscal year 2020-2021 as of February 2021.
- 7. For employer contributions paid to full-time faculty, 55% are for retirement; 35% health insurance; 5% workers compensation; 4% FICA Medicare.
- For employer contributions paid to part-time faculty, 48% are for health insurance; 37% retirement; 7% workers compensation; 6% FICA Medicare; 2% Social Security.
- 9. Many faculty are paid amounts in addition to regular pay according to their salary steps. In the 2019-2020 fiscal year, 125 full-time faculty (of 565 total) were paid more than the highest salary step amount for that year, which was \$123,775, due to additional salary items such as pay for department chairs and office hours. The highest earnings paid that year to a full-time faculty member was \$172,984.
- 10. CCSF has 60 departments, and each department has a chair who receives additional compensation.
- 11. External reports indicated that among California community colleges, CCSF full-time faculty were paid slightly above average, and part-time faculty were paid at the highest rates, based on salary step rates.

Audit Objective and Scope

The objective of this audit is to provide the Board, the Chancellor, and stakeholders with information summarizing the payroll records for full-time and part-time faculty. This audit examined the actual amounts paid by the college for salaries and benefits. The audit scope covers fiscal year 2019-2020 through fiscal year 2020-2021 as of February 2021.

Faculty Counts for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 and Fiscal Year 2020-2021

There was a slight decline in the number of full-time and part-time faculty from the prior fiscal year to the current fiscal year. During fiscal year 2019-2020, CCSF had 565 paid full-time faculty, and 548 in fiscal year 2020-2021 up to February 2021. During fiscal year 2019-2020, CCSF had 944 paid part-time faculty, and 935 during fiscal year 2020-2021 up to February 2021. These counts are of total paid employees paid at some point during the fiscal year, not necessarily the entire fiscal year.

Faculty Salaries and Benefits for FY 2019-2020 and FY 2020-2021

In fiscal year 2019-2020, full-time faculty salaries paid were \$61,434,267; benefits paid by the employer were an additional \$13,943,020, or 22.7%, for a total of \$75,377,287. For fiscal year 2020-2021 as of February 2021, salaries paid were \$41,017,851; benefits paid by the employer were an additional \$13,206,816, or 32.2%, for a total of \$54,224,667.

In fiscal year 2019-2020, part-time faculty salaries paid were \$24,466,521; benefits paid by the employer were \$3,874,701, or 15.8%, for a total of \$28,341,222. For fiscal year 2020-2021 as of February 2021, salaries paid by the employer were \$12,521,531; benefits were \$2,932,321, or 23.4% for a total of \$15,453,570.

This audit focuses on employer costs, but it should be noted that employees make significant contributions for their benefits. For full-time faculty, in fiscal year 2019-2020, employee contributions were \$15,308,130, and in fiscal year 2020-2021 employee contributions were \$15,365,980, as of February 2021. For part-time faculty, in fiscal year 2019-2020, employee contributions were \$4,386,688, and in fiscal year 2020-2021 employee contributions were \$3,129,468, as of February 2021.

Types of Faculty Earnings

For full-time faculty, regular pay is 95% of earnings paid by CCSF. Leave pay is 5% of earnings paid. All other categories of earnings are less than 1%. Regular pay includes pay for items such as department chair pay.

Faculty are paid by workload. Holidays are combined with their work load. Office hours are paid at the end of each semester, and the amount depends on the part-time faculty member's workload. Office hours are also paid via a timesheet that the employee is responsible for turning in.

A *leave* is an authorized absence from duty for a specific period of time. Some leaves are without pay, some leaves are with partial pay, and some leaves are with full pay.

Types of Employer Contributions to Faculty

For employer amounts paid to full-time faculty, 55% are for retirement; 35% are for health insurance; 5% are for workers compensation; 4% are for FICA Medicare.

For employer amounts paid to part-time faculty, 48% are for health insurance; 37% are for retirement; 7% are for workers compensation; 6% are for FICA

Medicare; 2% are for Social Security. Faculty do not contribute to Social Security because of contributions made to CalSTRS for their retirement; however, some faculty have also worked for at least part of the year in administrative roles, and administrators do contribute to Social Security.

Health Care Benefits for Part-Time Faculty

Part-time faculty who are beginning at least their third semester and who are assigned 50% of a full-time load in that semester are eligible for medical and dental/orthodontia coverage. Total cost of part-time faculty medical and dental coverage in fiscal year 2019-2020 was \$1,753,287, and in fiscal year 2020-2021 as of February 2021, CCSF paid \$1,515,146.

The costs to provide a part-time faculty member and full-time faculty member health care are equivalent, even though the part-time faculty member may have 50% of a full-time teaching load.

At most other California community colleges, part-time faculty are not eligible for health care benefits, so CCSF's cost of part-time faculty is higher.

Part-time faculty are typically used when full-time faculty are not available to teach scheduled courses.

Fund Sources for Faculty Salaries

Salaries for faculty are from approximately 50 funds. 82% of time paid to faculty are from the Unrestricted General Fund; 5% are from Matriculation Student Success and Support Program – Credit Fund; 2% are from the Strong Workforce Program Fund; other funds are 1% or less.

Comparison of Salaries with other California Community College Districts

Full-Time Faculty

To compare the level of faculty salaries at CCSF, Internal Audit used information from an annual report by the California Federation of Teachers. The most recent report covers fiscal year 2019-2020.

The study found that of the reported salary rates of 72 California community college districts, CCSF is ranked #29 for the lowest salary step, and #30 for the highest step. Based on salary steps, CCSF's full-time faculty salaries are slightly above average for all reported salary steps.

According to the current contract, for the annual salary for full-time faculty for the current fiscal year, salary step 1 is \$63,230. Salary step 1 is for minimum qualifications of an associate degree plus six years' experience. The highest salary step, PhD or a bachelor's degree plus 90 units with a master's degree, is \$127,310. See exhibit 3 on page 13 for details of district rankings. See Exhibit 5 on page 18 for the annual full-time faculty schedule.

Many faculty are paid amounts in addition to regular pay according to their salary steps. In the 2019-2020 fiscal year, 125 full-time faculty (of 565 total) were paid more than the highest salary step amount for that year, which was \$123,775, due to additional salary items like pay for department chairs and office hours. The

highest earnings paid that year to a full-time faculty member was \$172,984. CCSF has 60 departments, and each department has a chair who receives additional compensation.

Part-Time Faculty

This report from the California Federation of Teachers compares salaries for several steps for 72 California community college districts. For its lowest salary step and highest step, CCSF had the highest rates in the state. Step 1 F was \$104.35 per hour, and Step 14 F+60 was \$176.51 per hour. Office hours are not included in CCSF's hourly rate, though some districts do include office hours. CCSF pays office hours separately. CCSF's part-time faculty office hour rate ranged from \$44.72 to \$75.65.

For fiscal year 2020-21, Internal Audit calculates the CCSF part-time hourly rate as \$107.95 for Step 1 F, and \$182.30 for Step 14 F+60. The range for a salary workload unit is \$1,889.13 for Step 1 F to \$3,190.31 for the Step 14 F+60. The part-time faculty office hour rate is \$46.26 to \$78.13.

At CCSF, part-time faculty salaries are annualized at 86% of full-time salaries. This percentage is higher than most districts. For step 1 F the annual rate is \$56,674.00. For step G, the new step 16, which is based on budget contingencies, the annual rate is \$100,301.80. For details of other districts, see exhibit 4 on page 16. See Exhibit 6 on page 19 for the annual part-time faculty schedule, which assumes Full-Time Equivalent of 100% (workload of 15 units).
