No points will be awarded for out of state or expired certificates. Course completion certificates are not accepted. An applicant can repeat only one of the science courses listed in Group A: Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology. More than one repetition of any of these courses will disqualify the applicant. Repetition of a science course is defined as repeating a course due to a previous grade of “D”, “F” or “W”.  <b>Please Note: <u>No</u> “In Progress Courses” are considered for meeting course prerequisites upon Nursing enrollment.</b>

Certified Health Care Worker (CNA, EMT, Phlebotomist, Nurse Assistant, Veterinary Assistant)- >400 hours or more working healthcare within the last 2 years	<b>4</b>	Provide proof of work experience from current or former employer verifying number of hours worked per week, include job title, and date of employment on official letter head. The admissions committee will make the final determination of acceptance.
Work or Volunteer - 100 hours or more working/ volunteering in healthcare within the last 2 years	<b>3</b>	Provide proof of work/ volunteer from current or former employer verifying number of hours volunteering per week, include role and responsibilities, and date's on official letter head. The admissions committee will make the final determination of acceptance.

1 Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) or ATI TEAS offered through Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI).  2 Only the first attempt will be counted towards ranking.  3. 62% or above is passing. Students who are selected into the program with an overall TEAS score lower than 62% will require remediation.	<b>Maximum 30 points</b>  Score 93-100% (30 points) 86-92.9% (25 points) 80-85.9% (20 points) 74-79.9% (15 points) 70-73.9% (7 points) 66-69.9% (3 points) 62-65.9% (2 points)	<b>Required Documentation</b> Submit unofficial 1 <sup>st</sup> Attempt ATI TEAS score with your nursing application.  TEAS V or lower versions <b>WILL NOT</b> be accepted.  If selected, Applicants will be asked to submit their original ATI - TEAS Version 6 <b>FIRST ATTEMPT</b> score from ATI testing.  The official copy must be sent directly to the CCSF Nursing Program for confirmation.
