## ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

This statement constitutes approval of and support for the <u>articulated</u> Two Plus Two program in Automotive Technology:

In support of the basic principles that:

- A No student should be required to repeat instruction for competencies learned and for which credit has been granted, and,
- B. Students shall be allowed to reach their desired educational and *career* goals in an efficient sequence of incremental achievements, the following *terms* and conditions are agreed upon and approved.
  - I. Each student enrolling in City College of San Francisco shall meet the matriculation requirements in English or English as a Second . Language and Mathematics.
  - 2 A student may be admitted to the City College Automotive Technology program with ten college units in AutoTech 100 if,
    - a. the student passes the John O'Connell program with grades of B or better and receives school certification that equivalent competencies have been learned; or,
    - b. the student's high school portfolio is certified by both the high school and the CCSF Automotive Technology Department as meeting minimum competency requirements; or,
    - the student passes the challenge examination in automotive
      technology at City College of San Francisco with a score of 70 or better;
