## Articulation Program Area: Broadcast Electronic Media Arts

City College of San Francisco (CCSF), in cooperation with the Balboa Communication Arts Academy, San Francisco Unified School District, has agreed to grant placement and/or credit by examination option to students completing the following specific articulated course offered at Balboa Communication Arts Academy:

Broadcast Media & Production I and II (1166-5 units AND 1167-5 units} Course at Balboa Communication Arts Academy

## ARTICULATED WITH

## <u>Critical Television Viewing (BCST 101 - 3 units)</u> Course at City College of San Francisco

Placement for the articulated course listed above may be received if the following criterion are met:

- The Balboa Communication Arts Academy instructor assigned to teach Broadcast Media and Production I and II (1166 & 1167) has successfully completed <u>BCST 101: Critical Television</u> <u>Viewing</u> at City College of San Francisco, or a college-level equivalent of the course.
- 2. The student enrolling in City College of San Francisco will participate in the matriculation process in English or English as a Second Language and Mathematics.
- 3. The student has completed the articulated course listed above with an A grade.
- 4. The student must enroll in the Broadcast Electronic Media Arts instructional program within three · (3) years from the completion date of the course at the secondary level, and must successfully complete one course at CCSF. The student may elect to be concurrently enrolled in a class in the Broadcast Electronic Media Arts instructional program at City College of San Francisco during junior or senior year.
- 5. The student shall present the properly completed "Broadcast Electronic Media Arts Articulation Certificate" and high school transcript to the City College of San Francisco Program Advisor or Program Chair during which time the student will be advised of the curriculum sequence for their selected program, and the credit by examination option.
- 6. The student will not be required to repeat instruction for which competencies learned in the articulated course with an A grade for which credit has been granted.

This agreement will be reviewed by the High School Principal/Faculty and the College Program Chair annually and will remain in effect unless canceled by either party having given a 30-day written notice.
