Articulation Program Area: Automotive Technology

This statement constitutes approval of and support for the articulated program in Automotive Technology.

In support of the basic principles that:

- A. No student should be required to repeat instruction for competencies learned and for which credit has been granted, and,
- B. Students shall be allowed to reach their desired educational and career goals in an efficient sequence of incremental achievements, the following terms and conditions are agreed upon and approved,
 - 1. Each student enrolling in City College of San Francisco shall meet the matriculation requirements in English or English as a Second Language and Mathematics.
 - 2. A student may be admitted to the City College Automotive Technology program with eight college units in AutoTech 100 if,
 - a. the student passes the George Washington High School program with grades of B or better and receives school certification that equivalent competencies have been learned; or,
 - b. the student's high school portfolio is certified by both the high school and the CCSF Automotive Technology Department as meeting minimum competency requirements; or,
 - c. the student passes the challenge examination in automotive technology at City College of San Francisco with a score of 70 or better;

This Agreement will be reviewed by the High School Principal/Faculty and the College Program Chair annually and will remain in effect unless canceled by either party having given a 30-day written notice.
