This agreement must be reviewed and re-signed every two years or sooner if curriculum was changed by either the high school or CCSF.

This Agreement replaces all previous agreements for the program Identified above. This Agreement will be reviewed by the SFUSD Supervisor of Career Technical Education (CTE) and the College Department Chair/Articulation Officer annually and will remain in effect unless canceled by either party having given a 30-day written notice.
