Articulation Agreement

City College of San Francisco and Woodside High School Sequoia Union High School District

This statement constitutes approval of and support for the articulated program in Hotel and Restaurant Operations between Woodside High School and City College of San Francisco (CCSF).

In support of the basic principles that,

- 1. No student should be required to repeat instruction for competencies learned and for which credit has been granted, and
- 2. Students shall be allowed to reach their desired educational and career goals in an efficient sequence of incremental achievements,

a student shall be eligible for enrollment in the CCSF Hotel and Restaurant Program under the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Each student shall meet the CCSF matriculation requirements for all entering students in English, or English as a Second Language, and Mathematics; and
- 2. Each student shall attain an overall 2.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) at Woodside High School and at least a 2.0 GPA in the Woodside Consumer Home Economics Foods Program.

Additional provisions include the following:

High school seniors who have completed the Consumer Home Economics Foods program at Woodside High School in the junior year with a minimum 3.0 GPA shall be eligible to enroll in Hotel and Restaurant 1 (Orientation to Hospitality) and/or Microbiology 51 (Food Sanitation) at CCSF.
